ABSTRACT: Internal Quality Assurance Cell is conceived as a mechanism to build and ensure a quality culture at the institutional level. Concept of Accreditation has led to evolution of IQAC Cell. Colleges are taking a plunge into much embellished quality initiatives in order to survive in the sea of Quality Accreditation Process. Since IQAC forms an important aspect of QA & QE, institutions are leaving no stone under turned to accelerate its activities so as to score upon the respective criteria.

This paper outlines the case of IQAC cell of K J Somaiya College of Education has expanded and innovated. In the pursuit of survival numerous initiative were chalked, many died there natural death, few survived and still fewer emerged as the beg practices for the institutions. With each growing year much was learned and conversely a great unlearning also happened.

Selected practices like Faculty Forum- A Dialogue Platform for Exchange of Knowledge, Views and Research, Research, Research Progress Meet- A Six Monthly Confluence of Research Fellows, 360 Degree Feedback – A Wholesome Reflection into the Views and Purviews of All the Stake Holders, Gyanpushpanjali- Annual Research Paper Reading Session are presented as begin practices with objectives, process and challenge.

Suggestions for innovating and brainstorming for framing the best practices, ways of successfully achieving them, learnings from the practice and reflections are listed in conclusion.

# 1. INTRODUCTION:

Education is considered as an important indicator for the development of the nation. Setting benchmarks for quality and deciding upon the indicators for achievement is still the more important. This was the inception of the movement for opening IQAC Cells. Post this proposition many HEIs already have established the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) as a post accreditation quality sustenance activity. UGC made an important policy decision and directed all colleges to establish IQAC Cell. It is proposed that UGC will provide financial assistance for opening IQAC Cell.

The primary aim of IQAC was to develop a system for conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the

overall performance of institutions. It will provide momentum to generate 'good practices, ideas, planning, implementing and measuring the outcome of academic and administrative performance of the institution'. Further the functional IQAC and updated website became the important criteria for evaluating in the Re-accreditation process.

# Objectives of the Paper

The main objective of the paper is to bring to forefront the process of developing ideas and practices. Further it highlights the process through which the ideas elaborated, survived and emerged as best practices.

#### 2. RESULTS AND DISCUSSION:

## 2.1 EVOLVING BEST PRACTICES IN KISCCETR

#### Idea Generation

The inception of the work starts with the brainstorming session in which all the faculty members brain storm and contribute ideas for initiating the practice. During this session exemplars from different institutes and the best practices are taken into consideration. NAAC document on best practices is also referred for identifying the practices that have the feasibility of replication and capability of contribution towards the quality.

#### Building upon the Idea

The ideas that are generated in the brain storming sessions are discussed and elaborated further so as that it can take the shape of the initiative. In this step objectives of the practice are shaped and guidelines are developed for giving a sound background to the practice. Guideline development method is rigorous.
