 Ma. Damyantiben Mukeahbhai Pargi (PRN: 200010020021) is a student of the Center of Education, Gandhinagar for B.A. B.Ed. program. She appeared for the examination of Semester-5 and Semester 6 respectively in December-22 and May-23 Examination.

It came to notice that she appeared as a regular student in the December -22 examination despite her incomplete work for the subject Pre-Practice Teaching (193110) as her form was approved by the Center of Education mistakenly.

Student filled the examination form to appear for the University Examination of Semester-5 and the same was approved by the Head of the B.A. B.Ed. department, Center of Education. As per information provided to the examination branch by the email of the HOD; student didn't complete all the practical work needed to be completed for the grant of the term for Semester-5 and her term was granted and based on that her examination form was also approved by the HOD.

As per the Regulation 2021 – 29 – B

Student may be eligible to attend the semester- end examination if she has 80 % attendance in theory and 90 % attendance in practical work.

As per the Ordinance 2021 - 23 - [1][e]

For admission to 6th semester: All the candidates, even those who fail in all the courses/papers of 5th semester provided whose term of 5th semester is granted and student had cleared all the courses/papers of 2nd Semester are eligible for admission in 6th semester.

In the case of Ms. Damyantiben it seems that both of the above are mistakenly overlooked while granting the term and approving the examination form.

At the outset, the agenda is submitted for the decision of the following points:

- (1) to cancel her result of Semester-5 and Semester 6
- (2) to cancel her admission to Semester- 7
- (3) to consider her ineligible for her Semester -7 examination (Annexure-6)
- Resolution 8 The council discussed and it seems that there are multiple level errors viz. Student, Center of Education, Examination Branch and ERP System as it was the matter of December-2022 and consequently student is studying upto Semester-7, after detailed discussion and delibration it was set that the student shall be granted as a special case and the matter shall not be precedented at any other place.
- Agenda 9 Ms. Prakruti Joshi (PRN: 210040670062) was a student of the Center of Education, Gandhinagar for M.A. Education program. She was declared as a passing candidate, issued the mark sheets, and awarded a degree in the convocation of 2023.

It came to notice that she appeared as a regular student in the May 2021 examination and was unable to clear two subjects. Further, she filled out the form for one subject only to appear in the November 2022 ATKT Examination.

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The same form was approved by the Center of Education for further process. Further, as per the information provided by the HOD Diploma & Degree, she had done the required work for the Subject Code MAED 1050. The Center had also conducted the presentation of the student on 01-08-2022 as in this subject only internal assessment was there but not uploaded the marks in the ERP System.

Here technically if the student didn't select the concerned subject in the exam form of ERP, the Head of Department will not get the option for uploading the marks in the system.

The matter appears as that

- (1) the candidate had completed all the exam formalities except to fill the form in ERP at that time.
- (2) the ERP had not shown any flag that the candidate was with internal ATKT before declaring her as a passing candidate.
- (3) the ERP had not given any notice before issuing the passing mark sheet and awarding the degree in convocation.

At the outset, the agenda is submitted for the decision of the following points:

- (1) to consider the marks of subject MAED1050?
- (2) to re-declare the result of her semester-1 ATKT, Semester 3 and 4 after obtaining her original mark sheets
- (3) to reissue or cancel the degree certificate after obtaining her original degree certificate. (Annexure-7)

Resolution - 9

The council discussed and it is observed that the candidate had completed all the exam formalities to fill the form in ERP even though she had completed internal ATKT exam. It seems that there are multiple level errors viz. Student, Center of Education, Examination Branch and ERP System. It is decided that internal marks shall be uploaded to ERP and accordingly all concerned Marksheet shall be changed, if there is a change in CGPA/SGPA printed in the Degree certificate than the due degree certificate shall be awarded as per the provision. Further, in case of change the affidaivit shall be obtained from the candidate that she will not use/show the copies of marksheet and degree certificate anywhere for anycase.

Agenda - 10 To provide the information of the students whose recommendation as per Regulation 28 [1] (b) was made by the Director and by the Hon'ble Vice Chancellor. The agenda is submitted for ratification. (Annexure-8)

These four students have been detained to appear for examination. The agenda is put for deliberation, discussion and decision whether to allow these sixteen students to appear for the university level examination.

- Resolution 11 The agenda is mainly concern to the four students mentioned in second table. It is observed that the said four students have not been offered oppurtunity for the remedial classes durig Diwali Break & Sunday as it was offered to the students mentioned in First Table. It is suggested that such 16 days shall be counted as present days notionally for these four students. The detailed discussion, deliberation happened and it is opined that these four students mentioned in second table shall be allowed term grant on the said ground as per provision. Further, it adviced that from the upcoming semester the presence shall be taken lecture wise and to be recorded in ERP system. The necessary changes may be incorported in concern Regulation/Ordinance.
- Agenda 12 It was in consideration to make a provision of Amritkal Scholarship for bright students of various programmes at Centre of Education, IITE. There may be provision to identify and facilitate 25 students who have highest SGPA in a particular semester by waiving the semester tuitions fees under this scholarship. The Amritkal Scholarship will be for a period of five years from the date of approval. The agenda is submitted for deliberation and approval. (Annexure-9)
- Resolution 12 The council appreciated the effort of Amritkal Scholarship at the era of announcement of Viksit Bharat @ 2047 and ratified the same. The rules shall be prepared in detail before the commencement of the Amritkal Scholarship.
