"Do you feel any trouble in day to day life?" with such question and a small activity mentors introduced the PBL place to the students and shared that with all senses we sometimes behave like disable and the place where we are going there you would find different story than yours. So answer the question after the visit.

On 8th Mar 2017, Wednesday, students started their visit to Andh kanya Prakash Gruh situated behind manav manidr, memnagar, Ahmedabad. As scheduled earlier students had finished their lunch in the college around 11.30 AM. Then they gathered at bus near by 12.15 PM. Rameshbhai was with us as a driver, bus no. GJ 18 AZ 1432. Mentor Mrs. Tresia Paul, Ms. Sapna Mishra, Ms. Hiral Mehta and Ms. Kalindi Jadav joined the visit.

Originally visit was arranged ar 10.30 am but due to women's day celebration our visit was postponed at 1.30 PM. We reached the institute at 1.20 PM, that is before time. Celebration was near to end. Prize distribution was going on. Our students saw the girls and were amazed to see these girls walking and doing their work very normally like them without any regret on their face or in heart

Andh Kanya Prakash Gruh - the school cares for approximately 200 visually impaired girls. It offers lodging and boarding and in-house facilities in Braille education up to Class VII. For further studies up to Board level and for Bachelor and Masters degrees, girls attend local schools and colleges meant for sighted students. The main objective is to impart education to visually

impaired girls. They should develop into responsible citizens of India. They should also be given an opportunity to lead an independent life.

After the program was finished AKPG's girls went for lunch. Here our students sat and started discussing about the work they need to undertake and questions they need to ask. By 2 PM one of their faculty came to us and introduced students about the institute. Then one by one students entered the campus in group.

First, we saw the Girl's Hostel. In every room there were 4 beds. Most of the girls stay in the hostel. There was a notice board, on which notices were written in braille script.

From there we headed towards the backyard of campus which was not just the backyard but the special learning zone for the blind students. Where there was garden with slopes. So blind girls can understand the sloppy and flat surface. Also there were different statute of animal. Where those girls touch and feel and understand that how animal could look. Also they have made a bus stations demo, where the girls were taught how bus arrives, how they need to buy tickets and also how to stand in queue. There was miniature of everything. As these girls can't see anything but they can definitely feel everything.

From here, we went to individual classrooms. In Std:1, Hindi class was going on, where girls were giving their introduction in Hindi. As we entered these kids counted from 30 to 50 in Hindi. Our students were holding hands and talking to those kids.

In Std:2, girls were singing poem on Holi. They also sung another poem for us. In Std:4, English class was going on. There girls were reading the paragraph. We were amazed by the speed by which they were reading. Their books were in braille.

From there we went to computer lab. In computer lab, they were having a software which was helping them to work on computers. The computer Page 111

speaks as kids press any key or if there is any mistake the computer says itself. Here, these girls need to remember the keys and their exact location. By, which typing speed also increases.

From here we went to the class of home science where girls were cooking. We were surprised by seeing two blind girls making chapatti and cutting the veggies. As they finished cooking, every one of us tasted the food. It was yummy in taste. As students were tasting and praising girl's skills, girls were happy and felt motivated. Another group went to some girls and started singing group song. By which we also came to know that these girls are aware about current trends and movies and songs.

At the entrance there was a workshop where few girls were making handicraft items like, bracelets, necklace, and other ornaments by stones and other materials. Here our few students bought some necklace and bracelets too.

At the end of the visit, our students gasped in surprise. They got the answer of the question which their mentors asked them in the orientation, with absence of one sense if these girls lead their life with spirit and joy why can't we? No excuse now onwards we will accelerate our efforts for leading the life.

With the small game teachers started the PBL orientation process for 4th Type PBL - Special Child Institute. Where teachers selected 3 students from the class, sent them out of the class and then given instruction to rest of the class- not to support the three of them when they enter in class and try to do certain task. Teacher assigned 3 tasks to 3 students, among 3 one had to play the role of Blind person, one was Dumb and one had to play the role of handicapped person having no right hand. Tasks for three were - Blind student had to enter in the class and reach up to the last bench of right corner, Dumb student had to ask for the syllabus of biology and handicapped had to weave the choti of her friend with only one hand. All were curious, supportive and trying to know what and why was happening. With this small game teacher introduced the subject of Special Child and their life and conditions in front of the students and orient the students for the Special Child Institute Visit.

Under this PBL 4th Semester's 46 students are supposed to visit BPA- Blind People Association – BPA - ONE WINDOW SERVICE FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES. Blind People's Association is a professional organization which believes in providing equal opportunities to all categories of people with disabilities. Consistent with the philosophy, it works for providing education, employment opportunities, equal rights and quality life for them.

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On 10th April 2017 at 8.30 am bus – Driver Chandansinh (bus no : GJ18 G 8646) started from Hostel for the visit. Due to youth festival preparation 12 students were absent in the PBL. With 3 Faculty members Ms. Hiral Mehta, Ms. Jayati Brahmbhatt and Ms. Divya Shah students started the visit for BPA. They reached there by 9.45 am. Ms. Sharda was the coordinator for the campus visit. As soon as students reached there Shardaben came down and introduced all to Mr. Dave who took the students on campus visit.

Visit started with short introduction of BPA and then followed by visit of Kaushalya Vardhan Kendra. Where students saw printing, tailoring and textile printing units.

They saw the printing press where deaf dumb and other physically challenged people were working. They work on their own and earn money which helps them to survive and feed themselves. This shows the level of self-respect and dedication these people have.

After that students visited the IT lab. They saw blind students and their daily life struggle, yet they were so strong and stubborn about their life. Their positivity was very strong that it felt to us straight. Their admiration of work was really excellent and bar grace.

After IT lab visit all students went to the main attraction of BPA – "Vision In the Dark" - the museum aims primarily to sensitize those with sight about how those without sight manage their daily lives. It will give visitors experience of being blind. It will help them understand that there is no need to pity blind but be sensitive to their needs.

The museum houses models of different gods, national and international leaders, temple, mosque, church and a village. The only thing is that it is pitch dark and the visitors are blinded to the visual. The visitors can sense Page 117 the changes in their environment and decipher what exactly could be around

them or happening around them. Each statue has Braille marking and audio sensor.

As the visitors pass from one idol to the other, the sensor senses the movement and changes the music track, changes the audio with different surroundings. If the visitors are standing near statue of Mahatma Gandhi, the audio will play either his speech or the bhajan favourite of Mahatma. Similarly, if the visitors move on to other statue of Subhash Chandra Bose, the audio will change to his speech or song of Indian National Army.

The experience is so disconcerting for a person with sight. It hits the visitors hard as they only hear sounds and smell surroundings. Many people just freeze at the first step and only when assisted by visually impaired are they able to move ahead. It is only after moving around the pavilion for a few minutes does one get insight in to the real world of being visually impaired. It was wonderful experience for all the students that one hour in dark.

Having a cup of Tea and a plate of Poha at blind School Canteen students were sharing their experience of visit. They realized the real potential within themselves, also the limitations they have created at their own in their mind and decided to come out of it. After the visit near 3 pm all started back for the hostel with memories of BPA.

Introduction

Indian Institute of Teacher Education (IITE), a State Public University established under Gujarat Government Act 8/2010, is the University dedicated to Teacher Education. As per mandate, IITE has established five Centers. The Center of Special Education is responsible for providing constructive support to the children with special needs in conducive environment of Indian schooling system. The Center aspires to make a difference by making efforts towards development of inclusive society by training and nurturing teachers towards Inclusion, Equity & Equality though in service and preservice programs.

Samagra Shiksha - an overarching programme for the school education sector extending from pre-school to class 12 has been, prepared with the broader goal of improving school effectiveness measured in terms of equal opportunities for schooling and equitable learning outcomes. It subsumes the three erstwhile Schemes of Sarva Shiksha Abhiyan (SSA), Rashtriya Madhyamik Shiksha Abhiyan (RMSA) and Teacher Education (TE). One of the major objective of the scheme is to ensure equity and inclusion at all levels of school education.

Samagra Shiksha, Education Department, Government of Gujarat is committed towards the objectives of the scheme.

Context and Rational of the Project

Special educators / Inclusive Educators are trained for single disability. They are able to teach the children with any one or two disabilities in special school or in inclusive school. Special educators / Inclusive Educators are facing the difficulties to deal children with special needs in inclusive setup. Inclusive classrooms are full of diversities and different disabilities are there in a single class or in a school. In order to provide the quality education to children with special needs in inclusive setup, we need to build the capacity of inclusive educators. So there is a need to provide training to inclusive educators about other disabilities. There is a need to make the teachers aware about maximum possible disabilities as notified in the Rights of Person with Disabilities- 2016. This requires instructional adaptations and special

care needed to plan and provide necessary learning experiences for the achievement of learning outcomes. Intellectual Disabilities, Specific Learning Disabilities, Autism Spectrum Disorder, Hearing Impairment, Visual Impairment and other disabilities require instructional adaptations to be carried by the teachers to cope in mainstream classroom.

Thus there is a need to develop programs that focus on training teachers about basic and foundational knowledge about disabilities. Teachers should be aware of the types of disabilities that exist among children, measures for identifying teaching strategies, screening and assessment tools and other aspects which may help teachers in dealing with such type of situation in the classrooms. There is also a need to sensitize teachers about the special needs of all such children who have any sort of differential needs. There has to be an acknowledgement towards accepting the fact that there is a dire need to take care of the educational aspects of children with special needs and training teachers towards developing knowledge and skills needed for interacting in inclusive classroom.

Center of Special Education, IITE Gandhinagar and Samgra Shiksha, Education Department, Government of Gujarat have entered in Memorandum of Understanding to conduct and to sensitize and build the capacity of faculty and staff of Inclusive Education for Children with Special Needs (IE-CwSN) through multiple online/offline programs.

With an aim to achieve the objective of training teachers towards inclusion Center of Special Education is proposing a sensitization and capacity building program. The parent program was conceived with a rigorous residential face to face training for three days. In the current COVID 19 situation it may not be possible for the training to be provided through face to face mode. In an attempt to convert adversity into opportunity, CoSE, IITE proposes to conduct the training through online platform. - 3. Possible adaptations, accommodations and modifications for successful inclusion of children with special needs in inclusive setup.





- 1. Online training will be conducted under the Centre of Special Education, IITE Gandhinagar Gujarat and will be organized through suitable online platform. off-line training would be conducted in face to face mode and will be organized on the campus of IITE.
- 2. Technological platform for the online mode will be ZOOM/ Google Meet and google classroom or any other appropriate streaming option available at the time of program delivery. If the COVID 19 situation becomes normal the training program may be implemented through the off-line face to face mode. The place of training in such a situation would be IITE Campus or any other mutually agreed place.

Language of the Training

Language used for overall training program will be a mix of English, Hindi and may be Gujarati depending upon the language expertise of the resource person.

Resource Persons

1. Speakers for the training program will be from Centre of Special Education, IITE and whenever and wherever required Centre of Special Education, IITE will invite expert speakers from outside also.

Number of Participants

Number of participants for per batch will be limited to a maximum of 50 candidates to ensure personal care to each one of them.

The list of the participants shall be shared by the Samagra Shikha well before the scheduled training.

Training Specifications for both Online and Off-line Mode

1. Centre of Special Education and SSA Gujarat collaboratively decide the content for training.

- 2. Duration of training program will be 3 days per batch.
- **3.** 6 hours per day of lectures/ assignments/ videos and other possible modes will be used for training. These sessions will be variously divided on the basis of mode (online/off-line) and the type of content (lecture based/interactive/activity based)

Attendance

It will be compulsory for the participant to show a 100% attendance for the training program. He will also be required to submit all the assignments/feedback and any other such submission in order to successfully complete the criteria of attendance.

Evaluation

- 1. Evaluation will be an essential part of the training program and grades will be displayed in the certificate that would be given to the participants.
- 2. Test and assignment will be used for evaluating the participants.
- **3.** The evaluation may be conducted at the end of session/at the end of day/ at the end of the program depending on the requirement of the content and mode of training.
- **4.** The total evolution score will be 200. The assessment will be in the form of grading.
- 5. Grading will include A (91%-100%), B (81% 90%), C (71% 80%), D (61% 70%) and E (51% 60%) Grade. Any participant achieving a Grade of E will be considered as: 'NOT SUCCESSFULLY COMPLETED TRAINING'
- **6.** Thus it will be compulsory for all participants to get above 60% marks for passing the Training Program.
- 7. English and Hindi will be used as a language for all the test and assignment. If there is a request by SS for the use of Gujarati language, CoSE, IITE will consider it only for test and assignment portion. The same will be done with the help of language translator. The expenses of language translator will be included in the total budget.

Certificate

The format of the certificate will be mutually decided by CoSE, IITE and SS. The certificate will be provided in the soft copy/hard copy. The certificate will mention the duration of the program, attendance recorded and the grade achieved by the participant. It will be compulsory to complete all the requirements of the training program in order to get a certificate of passing and successful completion of the training program.

Miscellaneous

The total budget of the training included honorarium for resource person stationery expenses, infrastructure expenses, expenses of technical experts and technical resources, remuneration of training coordinator and co coordinators and IITE service charges and any other such expenses as the case may be. CoSE, IITE has taken the utmost care in keeping the budget at the minimum low that may be necessary for the effective planning and implementation of the training program.

The program was limited to 100 participants only. The program witnessed participants from almost 20 states of India. The program was streamed live on YouTube, links for the same are given below;



The following Act of the Gujarat Legislature, having been assented to by the Governor on the 22nd March, 2010 is hereby published for general information.

GUJARAT ACT NO. 8 OF 2010.

(First published, after having received the assent of the Governor, in the "Gujarat Government Gazette," on the 1" April, 2010).

AN ACT

to establish the Institute of Teacher Education to promote teachers' development of integral personality, wide vision of nationalism and internationalism, and to fulfill their role as exemplars, as friends, philosophers and guides, as scientists, psychologists, artists and technologists and above all as ideal communicators who can spread uplifting influence by the processes of awakening, inspiration and contagious enthusiasm, also to promote new trends of syntheses of the East and the West and agents of change from old to the new and to confer the status of a University thereon and for matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.

It is hereby enacted in the Sixty-first Year of the Republic of India as follows:-

CHAPTER I

PRELIMINARY

 This Act may be called the Indian Institute of Teacher Education, Oujarat Act, 2010.

Short title, extent and commencement.

(2) It extends to the whole of the State of Gujarat.

IV-Ex., 8-1

.

(3) This section shall come into force at once and the remaining provisions shall come into force on such date as the State Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, appoint.

Definitions 2.

- In this Act, unless the context otherwise requires,
 - (a) *Academic Council* means the Academic Council of the University established under section 22;
 - (b) 'Collaboration' means collaborative academic activity of the University with other Universities, other academic institutions (local, regional, national or international) and other research, educational, teaching, training institutions and organizations;
 - (c) 'College' means college of learning and training maintained by or recognized, affiliated or approved as such by the University;
 - (d) "Executive Council" means the Executive Council of the University constituted under section 20;
 - (e) 'Fee' means collection made by the University from the students for different purposes under different heads including tuition fee and development charges and the collection which is non-refundable;
 - (f) 'Finance Committee' means the Finance Committee of the University constituted under section 25;
 - (g) 'General Council' means the General Council of the University constituted under section 18;
 - (h) 'Institute' means the Indian Institute of Teacher Education, Gujarat, a University established and incorporated under section 3.
 - "Institution" means an institution which is a part of the University or it is associated with and admitted to the privileges of the University;
 - 'prescribed' means prescribed by rules, regulations, Statutes or, as the case may be, Ordinances made by or under this Act;
 - (k) 'Regulations' means the Regulations made under section 34;
 - (1) 'Research Council' means the Research Council of the University constituted under section 28;
 - (m) 'Standing Committee' means the Standing Committee of the University constituted under section 37.

CHAPTER II ESTABLISHMENT AND INCORPORATION OF UNIVERSITY

- There shall be established and incorporated a University Establishment by the name of 'the Indian Institute of Teacher Education, Guiarat'
 - incorporation of University.
- The Chancellor, the Vice-Chancellor, the members of the General Council, the Executive Council and the Academic Council, Registrar and all other persons who may hereafter become such officers so long as they continue to hold such office or membership, are hereby constituted a body corporate by the name of 'the Indian Institute of Teacher Education, Gujarat'.
- The University shall be a body corporate by the name aforesaid, having perpetual succession and common seal with power, subject to the provisions of this Act, to acquire and hold property, to contract and shall, by the said name, sue and be sued.
- In all suits and other legal proceedings by or against the University, the pleading shall be signed and verified by the Registrar and all processes in such suits and proceedings shall be issued to, and served on, the Registrar.
- The headquarters of the University shall be at Gandhinagar or at Headquarters such other place, as the State Government may, by notification in the of University. Official Gazette, specify.
- 5. The objects of the University shall be as follows:-

Objects of University.

- (1) to provide new structures to programmes of teachers' education and to provide to the country and even to the world at large new types of teachers who can find their home anywhere and everywhere and who have abilities, - linguistic and professional, - so as to serve the highest interests of the contemporary children who have new psychology and new demands to find and create new future.
- (2) to develop in particular, integrated courses of teachers' education that can be pursued by students, combining subjects of humanities, sciences, arts, crafts and technology along with those related to philosophy and psychology of education and pedagogy.
- to study and undertake research in the works of pioneering educationists of Gujarat, India as also of other parts of the world, who have underlined the need for holistic education so as to derive guidance from the same;

- (4) to establish and conduct institutions, centres and facilities for research in philosophy of education, psychology of education and sociology of education in the light of the lessons of Indian pedagogy as also of the progressive researches in education that underline child-centred holistic education and methodologies appropriate to the promotion of freedom and discipline and skilloriented and value-oriented education;
- (5) to evolve and implement a new programme of teacher education that will enhance -
 - (a) the synthesis of scientific realism and creative imagination;
 - (b) multilingual abilities;
 - (c) proficiency in pedagogy of high level achievements in various subjects and efflorescence of cognitive, co-native and effective faculties;
 - (d) mastery over new methodologies of education that blend advanced teaching instruments and subtle psychological sensibilities;
 - (e) proficiency in curriculum development in respect of various subjects of studies as also in respect of methodologies of testing students' performance, integral development of personality, and character that is committed to pursuit of nationalism, and highest welfare of humanity in terms of synthesis of Liberty, Equality and Fraternity;
 - (f) multisided physical education, healthcare and promotion of the international system of sports and games as also the spirit of youthfulness, adventure, and readiness to participate in services related to defence of peace and international understanding;
 - (g) nurturing exemplary character and competent abilities of communication that can awaken, inspire and enthuse the students;
 - (b) understanding of pupils in respect of their gifts and challenges that they confront in the process of their progress and harmonious and integral growth;
 - development of capacity to meet the challenges of explosion of knowledge and of constant changes in the roles of teachers; and

- promotion of general knowledge and wide vision of the development of future.
- to promote the indigenous tradition of teacher-student relationship (Guru-Shishya parampara) in various fields of humanities, arts, crafts, sciences, technologies and yoga (psychological and physical education);
- (7) to publish and disseminate results of advanced research relating to teachers' education for purposes of advancement of capacities to teach and learn among professional teachers as also among parents, social educators and social workers;
- (8) to promote national and international cooperation in teachers' education as also in the development of teaching-learning material through online programmes, documentaries, musical and dramatic programmes and films;
- (9) to undertake, conduct and promote any programme that will enhance the highest aims of pedagogy and synthesis of knowledge-systems and internationalism.
- (10) to promote the fundamental duties laid down in article 51A of the Constitution of India;
- to foster in the University highest purposes of education of the body, life and mind as also of the human spirit in its integrity;
- (12) to recover the lights from lessons of ancient wisdom in the context of modern development;
- (13) to establish facilities, programmes and activities of research, education, training and extension services that promote the highest aims of teacher education;
- (14) to introduce and nurture innovations in the education system so as to reflect India's spiritual knowledge, robust intellectuality and inexhaustible creativity;
- (15) to study and derive lessons from the ongoing experiments of education and to foster all the valuable innovative work and promote the same for larger expansion and utilization.
- 6. The powers and functions of the University shall be as follows:-

Powers and functions of University.

 to administer and manage the University and ensure efficient working of the centres, colleges and institutions related to research, education, training and extension services for the furtherance of the objects of the University;

- to regulate conduct and enforce discipline among the employees of the University and to take such measures as may be deemed necessary;
- (3) to prepare guidelines manuals and methodology for assessing performance of students, teachers and others related to the University, and to determine paradigms for quality assurance, processes and mechanisms in harmony with those developed by the National Commission for Teacher Education;
- (4) to establish, conduct and promote centres, such as -
 - (i) Centre of Research
 - (ii) Centre of Education
 - (iii) Centre of Training
 - (iv) Centre of Extension Services, and
 - (v) such other centres and institutions as may be necessary and to provide for facilities, including those relating to pedagogy for scientific discoveries and inventions, pedagogy for fine arts, pedagogy for crafts, promotion of NSS and NCC, promotion of scouts and guides, multilinguistic capacities (Gujarati, Sanskrit, French, English, Hindi, Tamil, Arabic, Spanith, etc.) development of curricular, co-curricular and extracurricular hobbics, puppetry, exhibitions, unending education, museum studies, library and film studies, etc.
- (5) to confer and award degrees diplomas, and certificates and provide for lectures, instruction and training for students as also for continuing education courses;
- (6) to confer honorary degrees or other academic distinctions;
- (7) to develop scademic relationship with primary and secondary schools which satisfy the needs and standards of the University and to empower them to receive the benefits of the results of the work of the University, and gradually to the entire education system of the State;
- (8) to create in the University campus as also elsewhere in the State, centres of education, research, training and extension services which will embody and crystallize the results of the work conducted by the University or elsewhere, and to spread benefits of the work of these centres to the entire system of teacher education in the State, and for that purpose to prepare teaching-learning materials;

- (9) to set up, conduct and promote, under the responsibility of the Centre of Research, various councils for research in subjects, as follows:
 - new roles of contemporary teachers;
 - (ii) Art and Science of nurturing gifted children;
 - (iii) Art and Science of care of the weak and of those who are psychologically and physically challenged;
 - (iv) special problems of childhood, adolescence and youth;
 - (v) philosophy and psychology of education in the light of indian pedagogy and contemporary development;
- (10) to set up, promote and conduct under the control and management of Centre of Research, several departments of research, instruction and communication in regard to themes, not so generic as those for the councils of research, but more specific and special such as those of:
 - unity of knowledge and interdisciplinary studies;
 - ii) new techniques of communication;
 - iii) curriculum development : ordinary courses, advanced studies and specialized courses;
 - iv) Indian and World history;
 - v) multilingualism and Indian and international languages;
 - vi) comprehensive physical education;
 - vii) village reconstruction;
 - viii) value-oriented education; and
 - ix) techno-pedagogy, etc.
- (11) to set up, conduct and promote a department of research in testing and evaluation and to support the requirement of creating a new system of testing services for the following purposes:-
 - removing from the students the fear of the examination so that tests are available by means of computer technology as and when the students are ready for the them, and even individually;
 - replacing the test of memory by the test of comprehension;
 - (iii) organizing tests for development of attitudes, aptitudes, personality, sterling qualities of character, and value oriented and skill oriented development, as also tests of physical fitness;
- (12) to establish, conduct and promote under the centre of extension services a centre for continuing education and of telecasting programmes of social education throughout the State, which will stimulate all-round interest in the promotion of the teacher

education formal, non-formal and informal, including methods of education through visits to museums and organization of exhibitions, and publications of brochures, pamphlets, occasional papers and other materials for the promotion of themes of teachers' education;

- (13) to undertake, organize and conduct programmes for the purposes of teachers' training for these who are to be engaged in work of teaching in various schools and institutions and to provide them a general programme of introduction to philosophy of teacher education and to the philosophy of holistic education, as also elementary courses related to the lessons of history, with special reference to Indian culture, its underlying spirituality, robust intellectuality and inexhaustible vitality;
- (14) to undertake, organize and conduct, under its Centre of Education, educational programmes for the University students admitted for various programmes of teacher education as also those engaged in research for M.Phil., Ph.D. and doctoral programmes relating to teacher education:
- (15) (a) to provide for instruction, extension, teaching and training in such branches or learning and courses of study as the University may, from time to time, determine;
 - to conceive, design, conduct and promote under the auspices of its Centre of Education, for candidates having in their background successful twelve year school education, high level integrated five year courses in Teacher Education leading to the degrees of M.A. (Education), M.Sc. (Education), M.Com. (Education), M.Ed.(Humanities), M.Ed.(Science), M.Ed.(Fine Arts), M.Ed. (Crafts), M.Ed. (Commerce), M.Ed. (Vocational Education), M.Ed. (Value-oriented Education) and such other courses of general or specialised nature or else four year integrated courses leading to the degrees, such as those of B.A., B.Ed.; B.Sc., B.Ed.; B.Com, B.Ed., provided that the courses shall be of general or specialised nature, including specialisation in teaching languages, history, geography, economics, political science, logic, philosophy, psychology, etc., and such other four years or five years integrated courses have special component of physical education (theoretical and Practical) with specialisation in yogic asanas and pranayama-gymnastics-athletics-aquaties and games (indian and western) and exposure to or participation in activities of NSS, NCC and Scouts and Guides provided that these courses will have as their component parts foundational courses consisting of elements such as those of general knowledge, fundamental duties, indian culture, value-oriented education, skill-oriented education, and introduction to the global world, etc.;

- to develop specialised departments, under the auspices of the Centre of Education, which will conceive, design, conduct and promote foundational courses, core courses and elective courses for full time candidates of the University, covering a wide range of subjects of humanities, sciences, fine arts, commerce as also those that will aid teaching in schools such of the subjects or topics that are relevant to home science. agriculture, horticulture, floriculture, multiple vocational courses, rural arts and crafts, philosophy of education, psychology of rational, aesthetic and ethical education, and philosophy and psychology of spiritual and integral education, prenatal and early childcare, philosophy of rights for children, technology for children, science for children, children's literature, fundamental duties, education for the gifted children, education for psychologically and physically challenged children's rights, children's films, students' counselling, problems of curriculum development, problems of rural reconstruction, etc.;
- (d) to provide interrelated connections amongst the following areas in all the integrated courses of teachers' education:

Area 1: Theoretical, Experiential and

Experimental Foundations of Education.

Area 2: Curriculum and Pedagogy.

Area 3: Practicum Courses and School Internship.

- (e) to conceive, design, conduct and promote under the auspices of its Centre for Training various short-term or longterm courses for pre-service or in-service training programmes centred on specific specialties or topics;
- (f) to organise under its Centre of Training several specialised in-service training courses so as to serve those --
 - (i) who need to migrate to a foreign country and
 - such other groups of candidates or teachers who have special needs for training;
- (g) to conceive, design, conduct and promote, under the auspices of its Centre for Extension Services, such programmes that are devoted to spreading in the society Science and Art of Pedagogy, as also Art and Science of Living, and lessons of Culture through various methods of instruction and publication of pamphlets and brochures, and other audio-visual material, specially designed to serve the parents to play the demanding new roles to become more and more competent teachers, and to enhance the causes of the aims of continuing education and lifelong education;

- (n) to permit its own facilities such as laboratories, film studies, and exhibitions for legitimate use by the public at large.
- (16) to create posts of Executive Officers, Directors, Professors, Associate Professors and Assistant Professors, and other members of academic and non-academic staff of equivalent responsibility, teaching or non-teaching academic posts of the University with the prior approval of the Executive Council and to prescribe the qualifications in accordance with the guidelines of the University Grants Commission or All India Council for Technical Education and other national statutory bodies and make appointments thereto; as well as to create non-teaching skilled, administrative, ministerial and other posts and to prescribe the qualifications and pay-scales with prior approval of the State Government and to make appointments thereto;
- (17) to appoint or recognize persons working in any other University or organization as adjunct professors, adjunct associate professors, adjunct assistant professors, visiting professors of the University for specified periods; and to facilitate mobility of academic members within the University and to other Universities:
- (18) to designate a University centre or institution, to monitor, periodically inspect and evaluate the academic performance of various Centers, Colleges and Institutions for ensuring proper standards of research, education, training, extension services, teaching and adequate library, laboratory, hostel and other academic facilities, in accordance with the guidelines, if any, laid down by the University Grants Commission, NCTE or by the Executive Council;
- (19) to make special provisions for the benefit of the University education to be made available to Socially and Educationally Backward Classes and communities particularly from rural and tribal areas;
- (20) to supervise, control and regulate the conduct and discipline and periodical assessment of the performance of the students and employees;
- (21) to establish teachers' education and training institutions of innovative education and to provide for education and training for implementation of the educational innovations;
- (22) to endeavour to earlich the present system of teacher education so as to make it more responsive to the ideals of Indian Nationalism and Internationalism:

- (23) to develop new system of teacher education as supplementary or alternative to existing system of teacher education for purposes of achieving higher goals of excellence;
- 24 to co-operate or collaborate with any other University, including any foreign University, Institution, Authority or Organization for research, educational, training and advisory services, as also for expansion of extensive services;
- (25) to borrow funds for the purposes of the University on the security of the property of the University, subject to the prior approval of the State Government;
- (26) to receive funds for collaboration programmes from foreign agencies subject to rules and regulations of the Contral Government and State Government in that behalf.
- (27) to organize and undertake extra-mural teaching and extension services:
- (28) to fix, demand and receive fees and other charges;
- (29) to supervise, control and regulate admission of students;
- (30) to establish, organize, maintain, manage and supervise and control the functioning of centres, departments, institutions, generally, and in particular, laboratories, film studios, libraries, museums, computer centres and equipment;
- (31) to implement the national literacy and adult education programme through teachers and students on voluntary basis in the University system and to evolve measures to give due emphasis to the efforts and performance of the students in this area in addition to their normal academic performance, and also to evaluate the performance of the teachers in this area;
- (32) to hold and manage trusts and endowments and institute and award fellowships, scholarships, studentships, medals and prizes for teachers and students of the University;
- (33) to receive grants, subventions, subscriptions, donations and gifts for the purpose of the University and consistent with the objects for which the University is established and to allocate and disburse grants out of the fund to institutions and courses recognized by it for the purpose of developing them so as to promote teacher education;
- (34) to consult and obtain concurrence of the various hodies in respect of recognition and accreditation granted by the statutory boards and Universities for the purpose of arriving at

....

equivalence of the course, programmes and evaluation system established by it with the existing standards of education; and

- (35) to do all such other acts and things as the University may consider necessary, conducive or incidental to the attainment or promotion of the objects of the University.
- Mode of 7 The University shall conduct its research programmes by research. employing various means as may be prescribed by the Statutes.
- Jurisdiction of R. The territorial jurisdiction of the University shall extend to the University. whole of the State of Gujarat.

University 9.

(1) No person shall be excluded from any office of the open to all University or from membership of any of its authorities or from irrespective of admission to any degree, diplome or other academic distinction or caste, sex or course of study on the grounds only of religion, race, caste, sex, place of optains birth or political or other opinion :

> Provided that the University may, subject to the previous sanction of the State Government, maintain, affiliate or recognize any college or institution exclusively for women either for education, instruction or residence, or reserve for women or members of classes communities which are educationally backward, places for the purposes of admission as students in any college or institution maintained or controlled by the University.

> It shall not be lawful for the University to impose on any person (2) any test whatsoever relating to religion, race, caste, sex or political or other opinion in order to entitle him to be admitted as a teacher or to hold any office in the University or to qualify for any degree, diploma or other academic distinction or to enjoy or exercise any privileges of the University or benefaction thereof.

CHAPTER III OFFICERS OF UNIVERSITY

Officers of 10. The following shall be the officers of the University, namely :-University.

- (i) The Chancellor,
- The Vice-Chancellor. (ii)
- The Registrar, (iii)
- (iv) The Finance and Accounts Officer, and
- such other officers as may be declared by the Statutes to (v) be the officers of the University.

Chancellor, 1L. (1) The Governor of Gujarat shall be the Chancellor of the University. He shall, by virtue of his office, be the head of the University.

The Chancellor shall have the following powers and functions :

- (2) The Chancellor, when present, shall preside at the Convocation of the University and may issue direction to the Vice-Chancellor to convene the meeting of any authority of the University for specific purposes.
- (b) The Chancellor, in the interests of the University, may direct the Standing Committee to look into the matter of disqualification of any member of the University, authority, body or committee, the conduct of any nominated or appointed or co-opted member if he thinks it is against the smooth functioning of the University.
- 12. (1) The Vice-Chancellot shall be appointed by the State Vice-Chancellor. Government in consultation with the Chancellor in the manner stated bereunder:-
- (2) (a) There shall be a Search Committee constituted by the State Government consisting of three members, to be nominated by the State Government to recommend suitable names, for appointment of Vice-Chancellor. The member of the Search Committee shall be from any one or more of the following estegories, namely:
 - (i) un eminent educationist;
 - (ii) a retired Judge of the High Court of Gujarat;
 - (iii) a retired Chief Secretary/Additional Chief Secretary of the Government of Gujarat;

The State Government shall nominate one of them as the Chairman of the Committee.

- (b) The members nominated for the committee shall be the persons who are not connected with the University or any institution of the University.
- (3) The committee appointed under sub-section (2) shall begin the process of recommending the panel of names for the appointment of the Vice-Chancellor, at least four months before the probable date of occurrence of the vacancy of the post of the Vice-Chancellor and shall complete within the time limit as may be fixed by the Chancellor. The State Government may extend the time limit if in the exigency of the circumstances, it is necessary so to do:

Provided that the period so extended shall not exceed three months in the aggregate.

- (4) The committee shall consider and recommend the names of persons who possess the following qualification for the post of Vice-Chanceller:
 - (a) leadership in any field of teacher education and development with the experience of having served in a university or an educational institution for not less than ten years and is renowned for research or creative work as evidenced through publications or guidance provided to research students of a University or College or leadership provided to the field of humanities, science, fine-arts and crafts, technology, medicine, industry; or
 - (b) leadership in the field of administration as evidenced through service of ten years of experience as a Registrar in a University or as a Principal of a college or in a research scademy or a Research Council under the State or the Central Government;
- (5) The search committee shall recommend a panel of three suitable persons for the consideration of the Chancellor for being appointed as the Vice-Chancellor. The names shall be in alphabetical order without any preference being indicated. The report may be accompanied by detailed write-up suitability for each person included in the panel.
- (6) The State Government shall, in consultation with the Chancellor, appoint one of the persons included in the panel referred to in subsection (5) as the Vice-Chancellor of the University.

- 13. (1) The Vice-Chancellor shall hold office for a term of five years from the date he enters upon his office or till attaining the age of sixty-five years, whichever is earlier and shall not be eligible for reappointment.
- (2) (a) During the leave or absence of the Vice-Chancellor, or
 - (b) in the event of a permanent varancy in the office of the Vice-Chancellor, until an appointment is made under sub-section (1) of section 12 to that office.

the Dean, as nominated by the Vice-Chapcellor, shall carry on the current duty of the office of the Vice-Chapcellor.

- (3) The Vice-Chancellor shall be a whole-time salaried officer of the University and his pay, allowances, emoluments and other terms and conditions of service shall be such as may be prescribed.
- (4) The Vice-Chancellor may, by writing under his signature addressed to the Chancellor, after giving one menth's notice, resign his

office and such resignation shall take effect from the date of acceptance of his resignation by the Chancellor.

- The Vice-Chancellor may be removed from his office if the (5) Chancellor in consultation with the State Government, is satisfied that the incumbent,
 - has become insane and stands so declared by a competent (a) court;
 - has been convicted by a court for any offence involving (b) moral turpitude;
 - has become an undischarged insolvent and stands so (c) declared by a competent court,
 - has been physically unfit and incapable of discharging (d) functions due to protracted illness or physical disability;
 - has willfully omitted or refused to carry out the (e) provisions of this Act or has committed breach of any of the terms and conditions of the services as prescribed by the State Government or has abused the powers vested in him or if the continuance of the Vice-Chancellor in the office is detrimental to the interests of the University;
 - is a member of, or be otherwise associated with, any (f) political party or any organization which takes part in politics, or is taking part in, or subscribing in aid of, any political movement or activity:

Provided that the Vice-Chancellor shall not be removed from his office unless an opportunity of being heard is given to him.

The Vice-Chancellor shall be the principal academic and Powers and executive officer of the University responsible for the efficient functions of functioning and development of academic programmes of the Chancellor. University. He shall oversee and monitor the administration of the academic programmes and general administration of the University to ensure efficiency and good order of the University.

- He shall be entitled to be present, with the right to speak, at any meeting of any authority or body of the University, but shall not be entitled to vote therent, unless he is the Chairman or a member of that authority or body.
- It shall be the duty of the Vice-Chancellor to ensure that the directive of the State Government, if any, and the provisions of the Act, the Statutes, the Ordinances and the Regulations are strictly observed

and that the decisions of the authorities, bodies and committees which are consistent with the Act, the Statutes, the Ordinance or the Regulations are properly implemented.

(4) The Vice-Chancellor may take suitable action in case of any emergency, in interest of the University:

Provided that, where any such action taken by the Vice-Chancellor affects any person in the service of the University, such person shall be entitled to prefer, within thirty days from the date on which he receives notice of such action, an appeal to the Executive Council.

- (5) The Vice-Chancellor shall be the appointing and disciplinary authority for Registrar, Finance and Accounts Officer, Members of the Academic Staff of the University and officers of the University of the rank of Assistant Registrar and of the rank equivalent thereto and above.
- (6) The Vice-Chancellor shall place before the Executive Council a report of the work of the University periodically.
- (7) The Vice-Chancettor shall have the right to cause an inspection to be made by such person or persons or body of persons as he may direct, of the University, its buildings, laboratories, libraries, museums, workshops and equipments, hostels maintained or recognized by the University, and of any institution of the examinations, teachings and other work conducted by or on behalf of the University, and to cause an inquiry to be made in a like manner regarding any matter connected with the administration, finance, and academic activity of the University.
- (8) The Vice-Chancellor shall exercise such other powers and perform such other functions as may be prescribed by or under this Act.
- Registrar, 15. (1) The Registrar shall be appointed by the Vice-Chancellor on the recommendations of the standing committee.
 - (2) The qualification, salary, emoluments, other perks and allowances and the terms and conditions of service of the Registrar shall be such as may be prescribed by the Statutes.
 - (3) The Registrar shall be a full-time salaried officer of the University and shall work directly under the superintendence, direction and control of the Vice-Chancellor.
 - (4) Appointment of the Registrar shall be for a term of five years and he shall be eligible for re-appointment for further term of five years.
 - (5) When the post of Registrar remains vacant for any reason or when the Registrar is, by reason of illness or absence or any other cause, unable to perform the duties of his office, the Vice-Chancellor shall

appoint a senior officer of the University to officiate as the Registrar axis the Registrar resumes duty.

- The Registrar shall be the ex-officio Secretary of the General Council, Executive Council and Academic Council.
- The Registrar shall be the appointing and the disciplinary authority of the employees of the University other than the teachers, non-vacation academic staff and officers of the rank of Assistant Registrar and other officers holding posts equivalent thereto or above.
- (8) Subject to the decision of the authorities of the University, the Registrar shall have the power to enter into agreements, sign documents and authenticate records on behalf of the University.
- (9) The Registrar shall be the custodian of the records, the common scal and such other property of the University as the Executive Council may commit to his charge.
- (10) The Registrar shall exercise such other powers and perform such other duties as prescribed by Statutes or assigned to him, from time to time, by the Vice-Chancellor.
- 16. (1) The Finance and Accounts Officer shall be appointed by Finance and the Vice-Chancellor in such manner and shall exercise such powers and Accounts Officer. perform such duties, as may be prescribed by the Statutes.
- (2) The qualification, salary, allowances, emohaments, other perks and facilities and terms and conditions of service, the tenure of the Finance and Accounts Officer shall be such as may be prescribed by Statutes.
- (3) When the office of the Finance and Accounts Officer is vacant or when the Finance and Accounts Officer is, by reasons of illness, absence or any other cause, unable to perform the duties of his office, the duties of the office shall be performed by such person as the Vice-Chancellor may appoint for the purpose.
- (4) The Finance and Accounts Officer shall
 - (a) exercise general supervision over the funds of the University and shall advise as regards its financial policy;
 and
 - (b) perform such other financial functions as may be assigned to him by the Executive Council.

CHAPTER IV AUTHORITIES OF UNIVERSITY

Authorities of 17. The following shall be the authorities of the University, University, namely:-

- (i) The General Council;
- (ii) The Executive Council;
- (iii) The Academic Council;
- (iv) The Finance Committee; and
- (v) such other authorities of the University as may be declared by the Statutes, to be the authorities of the University.

General 18. (1) The General Council shall be the apex authority of the Council. University.

- (2) The General Council shall consist of the following members, namely:
 - the Chancellor, who shall be the Chairperson of the General Councit;
 - (ii) the Vice-Chancellor,
 - the Minister-in-charge of Education (Primary, Secondary, Adult), Higher and Technical Education, Gujarat State or his nominee;
 - (iv) the Minister-in-charge of Women and Child Welfare, Gujarut State or his nominee;
 - (v) the Executive Chairperson, Gujarat Educational innovations Commission;
 - (vi) the Chaimpan, University Grants Commission or his nominoe;
 - (vii) the Chief Secretary, Government of Gujarat;

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- (viii) the Secretary to the Government of Gujarat, Education Department or his nominee not below the rank of Deputy Secretary;
- (ix) the members of Gujarat Educational Innovations Commission;
- (x) the Secretary to the Government of Gujarat, Primary Education or his nominee not below the rank of Deputy Secretary;

- (xi) the Secretary to the Government of Gujarat, Women and Child Development Department or his nominee not below the rank of Deputy Secretary;
- (xii) the Chairman, National Council for Teacher Education of his pomince;
- (xiii) the Commissioner of Higher Education, Gujarat State or his nominee not below the rank of Joint Director;
- (xiv) the Commissioner of Schools, Gujarat State or his nominee not below the rank of Joint Director;
- (xv) the Director, Gujarat Council of Educational Research and Training, Gandhinagar;
- (xvi) the Chairman, Gujarat Secondary and Higher Secondary Education Board, Gandhinagar;
- (xvii) all directors of the University;
- (xv:si) the Director-General, NCC Headquarters, Ahmedabad;
- (xtx) the State Chief Commissioner. Objard State, Bharat Scouts and Guides;
- two leaders of experimental or innovative Education to be nominated by the State Government;
- (xxi) all members of Executive Council;
- five persons to be nominated by the State Government, who shall include distinguished educationist, scholars, social workers or representatives of industry and professions;
- (xxiii) the Registrar shall be the Member-Secretary of the General Council.
- (3) The term of members other than the ex-officio members shall be five years.
- (4) The General Council shall meet at least once during a calendar year.
- (5) The quorum shall not be less than one-third of the total number of members of the General Council.

Powers and 19. The General Council shall have the following powers and functions of functions, namely:-

General Council.

- to approve and endorse the University's strategic plan, calendar, and monitor the University's performance periodically;
- (2) to prepare and submit annual report to the State Government on the affairs of the University generally, and in particular on management of the University's resources;
- (3) to determine the academic awards, degrees, diplomas, certificates, concessions of fee, awards of Fellowships and Studentships to be offered by the University in consultation with the Academic Council; and
- (4) to exercise such other powers and perform such other functions as may be necessary for the efficient functioning of the University.

Executive 20. The Executive Council shall be the chief executive body of the Council. University and shall consist of the following members, namely:-

- (i) the Vice-Chancellor, ex-officio Chairperson;
- the Secretary to the Government of Gujarat, Education Department or his nominee not below the rank of Deputy Secretary;
- the Secretary to the Government of Gujarat, Finance Department or his nominee not below the rank of Deputy Secretary;
- (iv) the Commissioner of Higher Education, Gujarat State or his nominee not below the rank of Joint Director;
- (v) two members of the Academic Council to be nominated by the Vice-Chancellor;
- (vi) four members to be nominated by the State Government from amongst the members of the General Council;
- (vii) the Finance and Accounts Officer;
- (viii) the Registrar shall be the Member-Secretary.

21. The Executive Council shall have the following powers and Powers and functions, namely :-

functions of Laccutive Council.

- to enter into, vary, carry out and cancel contracts on behalf of the University;
- to determine the form of a common seal for the ib. University and provide for its custody and use:
- to accept trusts, bequests, donations and transfer of any (0) movable or immovable property on behalf of the University;
- to transfer by sale, or otherwise, any movable property on (d) behalf of the University:
- to borrow, lend or invest funds on behalf of the (e) University on the recommendation of the Finance Committee;
- (1) to lay down policy for administering funds at the disposal of the University for specific purposes;
- to make provisions for buildings, premises, furniture, (g) apparatus and other means needed for the conduct of the work of the University;
- (h) to hold, control and arrange for administration of assets and properties of the University;
- to approve the annual accounts and the budget estimates (i) received from the Finance Committee;
- to lay down terms and conditions of service and other (i) guidelines approved by the State Government from time to time; and lay down the procedure for appointment of University/college teachers and non-vacation academic staff and fix their emoluments and norms of workload. conduct and discipline;
- (k) to create posts of University teachers, officers, nonvacation academic staff and other employees of the University, subject to prior approval of the State Government;
- (1) to exercise such other powers and perform such other functions as may be necessary for the efficient functioning of the University.

Council.

Academic 22. The Academic Council shall consist of the following members,
Council, namely:-

- (i) the Vice-Chancellor, ex-officio Chairperson;
- (ii) all the Directors of the University,
- (iii) all the Professors of the University or Heads of Institutions of the rank of Professors;
- (iv) the Heads of recognized and approved colleges or institutions;
- (v) all the Scholars nominated in the Councils of Research;
- (vi) all Fellows of the University;
- (vii) three students nominated by the Vice-Chancellor on the basis of their excellence in regard to their outstanding performance in any of the academic and extra-curricular activities in the immediate preceding year;
- (viii) the Registrar shall be the Member-Secretary.

Powers and 23. The Academic Council shall have the following powers and functions of functions, namely:-

- to recommend to the Executive Council for the institution of degrees, diplomas, certificates, as also their equivalence, if required, with the degrees, diplomas, certificates of the other Universities, recognized Boards of Studies and examinations and also recommend other academic distinctions;
- (2) to make proposal to the Executive Council for the institution of fellowships, travelling fellowships, scholarships, studentships, medals and prizes and make regulations for their award;
- to grant affiliation and recognition to colleges or institutions;
- (4) to accord recognition to institutions of research or specialized studies on the recommendations of the committees appointed by the General Council;
- (5) to advise the University on all academic matters and submit to the Executive Council the details of the academic calendar and feasibility reports on academic programmes;
- to determine research areas as well as promote research in the University;

- to recommend for the visiting professors;
- to propose, organize special seminars, conferences and workshops;
- (10) to implement the resolutions adopted by the Executive Council in respect of academic and research programmes and other activities:
- (11) to constitute committees for specific purposes, in such manner as may be determined by it, and may designate one of its members as Chairperson of the committee;
- (12) to consider and adopt the annual report, annual accounts and audit report and forward them to the Executive Council for approval;
- (13) to delegate any of its powers, except the power to make, amend or repeal Ordinances, to such officer or authority of the University or a committee appointed by it, as it thinks fit;
- (14) to make recommendations to the Executive Council with regard to the creation, abolition or classification of teaching, research and supervisory and advisory posts in the University and qualifications, emoluments and the duties attached thereto;
- (15) to formulate, modify or revise schemes for the organizations of the centres, council and departments of research, colleges, or other organization and specialized institutes, and to assign to them their respective subjects and also to report to the Executive Council for its approval;
- (16) to consider proposals submitted by the departments, centres, councils and other recognized colleges;
- (17) to make recommendations to the Executive Council in regard to the appointment of examiners and fixation of their fees, emoluments and travelling and other expenses;
- (18) to make arrangements for the conduct of examinations and to fix dates for such examinations;
- (19) to declare the results of examinations, or to appoint committees or officers for declaration of such result, and to make recommendations regarding the conferment or grant of degrees, bonours, diplomas, certificates, titles and marks of honour;

- (20) to perform, in relation to academic matters, all such duties and to do all such acts as may be necessary for carrying out the provisions of this Act and the Regulations.
- Meetings of 24. (1) The Academic Council shall meet as theny times as may Academic be necessary, but at least once in six months.

 - (2) The Vice-Chancellor shall preside at the meeting of the Academic Council.
 - (3) The Academic Council shall meet at such time and at such place and with such period of notice and shall observe such rules of procedure in regard to transaction of its business at its meeting, including the quorum at such meeting as may be prescribed;
 - (4) When any urgent action is required, the Vice-Chancellor may, with the approval of the majority of the members of the Academic Council, permit the business to be transacted by circulation among the members of the Academic Council. The action so taken as approved by circulation shall be placed before the next meeting of the Academic Council.
- Finance 25. (1) The Finance Committee shall consist of the following Committee members, namely:-
 - (i) The Vice-Chancellor,
 - (ii) The Registrar,
 - (iii) The Finance and Accounts Officer,
 - (iv) One member of the Executive Council, to be nominated by it.
 - (v) One member, to be nominated by the State Government.
 - (2) The turm of members other than the ex-officio members shall be of three years.
 - (3) A member comminsted by the Executive Council shall cease to be a member of the Finance Committee, if he ceases to be a member of the Executive Council.

Powers and 26. (1) The Finance Committee shall have the following powers and functions of functions, namely:-

- to examine and scrutinize the annual budget of the University and to make recommendations on financial matters to the Executive Council;
- to consider all proposals for new expenditure and to make recommendations to the executive council;

- to consider periodical statement of accounts and to 101 review the finances of the University from time to time. to consider unnual accounts and balance sheet of the University and mudited statements and audit reports, and to make recommendations thereon to the Executive Council:
- to advise and to make recommendations to the fixecutive (d) Council on any financial matters affecting the University. either on its own motion or on reference from the Executive Council.
- The Finance Committee shall meet at least once in every six months. Three members of the Finance Committee shall form the quorum for a meeting.
- The Vice-Chancellor shall preside at the meetings of the Finance Committee.
- The annual report of the University shall be prepared under the direction of the Finance Committee and shall be submitted along with its comments to the Executive Council on or before such date as may be prescribed and shall be considered by the Executive Council at its annual meeting.
- A person shall be disqualified for being appointed or for being a Disqualifications member of any of the authorities of the University, if he -

for membership of authorities of University.

- is of unsound mind and stands so declared by a (a) competent court;
- is an undischarged insolvent and stands so declared by a (b) competent court;
- has been convicted of any offence involving moral (c) turpitude;
- is conducting or engaging himself in private tuitions or (d) private coaching classes;
- has been punished for indulging in or promoting unfair (e) practices in the conduct of any examination in any form;
- discloses or causes to disclose to public, in any manner (f) whatsoever, any confidential matter, in relation to examination, the knowledge of which he has come to be in possession, due to his official position.

CHAPTER V RESEARCH COUNCILS

Constitution 28, and functions rest of Research in the Council.

- 28. (1) There shall be set up under the control of the centre of research, various councils for research as may be necessary, for research in the various subjects related to teacher education.
- (2) Each Research Council shall consist of the Vice-Chancellot as its Chairman and the Director who shall be of the rank of the professor and shall act as the Member-Secretary.
- (3) Each Research Council shall consist of four Scholars nominated by the Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Member-Secretary and approved by the Academic Council.
- (4) The Scholars shall be eminent educationists in the subject for which the coupeil is constituted and their role shall be to bring to the council their expert advice so as to promote research work of the council.
- (5) The Scholars in each council shall not be entitled to any salary or emoluments but shall be entitled to a fee as may be prescribed by the regulations of the University for attending the meeting as also facilities for travel, transport and accommodation for each of their visits that they may be required to perform.
- (6) The Council shall meet at such time and place, and shall observe such rules of procedure with regards to transaction of its business at the meeting as may be deemed necessary by it.
- (7) For research in the research councils, there shall be a provision of fellowships which shall consist of not more than twenty-five fellows.
- (8) The Fellows shall be selected by a committee appointed by the Academic Council:

Provided that twelve of the fellowships shall be awarded for junior research fellows enrolled in the University for M.Phil. and Ph.D. research work:

Provided further that one l'ellow shall be awarded a national fellowship to the selected from among eminent educationists and the remaining twelve fellowships shall be awarded as senior fellowships to eminent educationists of the trank of Associate Professors and Assistant Professors of the University.

- nach Fellow shall carry out research in any subject related to the themes of councils of research and deliver tectures in the University whenever so required.
- 10. The term of a Fellow shall be of two years within which he shall write a thesis of fellowship on the subject assigned to him:
 - Provided that the Academic Council may extend the term by one year.
- (11) The salary and allowances payable to a Feilow shall be such us may be determined by the regulations of the University in accordance with the scheme of Fellowships of the University Grants Commission.

CHAPTER VI FINANCE

- (1) The University shall establish a Fund to be called the University University Fund.
- (2) The following shall form a part of, or be paid into the University Fund —
 - any contribution or grant made by the State Government, Contral Government or an agency of the Central Government;
 - (ii) any bequests, donations, endowments or other grants made by any private individual or institution;
 - income received by the University from all the sources including income from fees and charges; and
 - (iv) amounts received from any other source.
- (3) The University Fund shall be kept in any Scheduled Bank as 2 of 1934 defined in the Reserve Bank of India Act, 1934 or in a Co-operative Bank approved by the State Government for the purpose.
 - (4) The University Fund shall be utilized for such purposes of the University and in such manner as may be prescribed by the Statutes.
 - 30. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act or the Fund of regulations, whenever the University receives funds from any sponsored Government or other agencies sponsoring a scheme to be executed by the University, -
 - the amount received shall be kept by the University in separate account and shall be utilized for the purpose of the scheme; and

- (2) the staff required to execute such scheme shall be recruited in accordance with the terms and conditions stipulated by the sponsoring organization.
- Accounts, Audit 32. (1) The annual accounts and balance sheet of the University and Annual shall be prepared under the direction of the Executive Council and shall, Report, every year, be audited by the auditors appointed by the State Government.
 - (2) The annual accounts, the balance sheet and the audit report shall be considered by the Executive Council at its annual meeting and it may, by resolution make recommendations with reference thereto and communicate the same to the Firance Committee.
 - (3) A copy of the annual accounts and the balance sheet together with the audit report thereon shall be submitted by the University to the State Government along with the statement of action taken by the University on the said report.
 - (4) Any observations made by the State Government on the annual accounts shall be brought to the notice of the University and the compliance report on such observations shall be submitted to the State Government.
 - (5) The Executive Council shall also prepare, before such date as may be prescribed by the Statutes, the financial estimates for the ensuing year. The annual accounts and financial estimates shall be considered by the General Council shall also prepare, before such date as may be prescribed by the Statutes, the financial estimates for the ensuing year. The annual accounts and financial estimates shall be considered by the General Council at its annual meeting and may be passed with such modifications as the General Council may deem fit.

CHAPTER VII STATUTES, ORDINANCES AND REGULATIONS

Statutes. 32. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Executive Council may make the Statutes to provide for all or any of the following matters, namely:

- conferment and withdrawal of honorary degrees and other scademic distinctions;
- (ii) holding of convocation to confer degrees and diplomas;
- (iii) powers, duties and functions of the officers of the University;

- constitution, powers and duties of the authorities of the University.
- testitution and maintenance by the University, of departments, institutes of research or specialized studies, post-graduate centres in affiliated colleges and hostels.
- acceptance and management of bequests, donations and endowments;
- (vii) manner of utilization of the University Fund;
- (viii) registration of graduates and maintenance of a register of registered graduates;
- (ix) manner and rules of procedure in regard to transaction of business at the meetings including the quorum of the meeting, of the authorities of the University and for the transaction of business;
- qualifications of professors, readers, lecturers and teachers in approved and recognized institutions;
- the maximum number of students to be admitted in a centre, school and institution;
- (xii) suitable and adequate physical facilities such as buildings.
 Iaboratories, library books, equipments required for teaching and research, hostels, etc.;
- (xiii) to conduct various research programmes;
- (xiv) qualifications, salary, allowances, emoluments and other terms and conditions of service of the Registrar and the Finance and Accounts Officer:
- (xv) manner of appointment of the Finance and Accounts Officer;
- (xvi) preparation of the financial estimates for the ensuing year.
- (xvii) all other matters which by or under this Act are to be or may be prescribed by the Statutes;
- (2) The Statutes may be made, amended or repealed by the Executive Council in the manner hereinafter provided.
- (3) The Executive Council may take into consideration the draft of Statutes either of its own motion or on a proposal made by any other authority of the University. The Executive Council, if it thinks IV-Ex., 8-8

necessary, may also obtain the opinion of any officer, authority or body of the University in regard to any draft Statutes which is before it for consideration:

Provided that where any draft Statutes pertains to academic matters, the Executive Council shall obtain the opinion of the Academic Council before considering the same.

- (4) Every Statute passed by the Executive Council shall be presented to the Chancellor who may give or withhold his assent thereto or refer it back to the Executive Council for reconsideration.
- (5) No Statute passed by the Executive Council shall be valid or shall come into force until assented to by the Chancellor.
- (6) Notwithstanding anything contained in the foregoing provisions, the Chancellor, on the advice of the State Government direct the University to make provisions in the Statutes in respect of any matter specified by him and if the Executive Council fails to implement such a direction within sixty days of its receipt, the Chancellor may, after considering the reasons, if any, communicated by the Executive Council for its inability to comply with such direction, make or amend the Statutes suitably as advised by the State Government.
- Ordinances. 33. (1) Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Executive Council may make the Ordinances to provide for all or any of the following matters, namely:-
 - the conditions under which students shall be admitted to courses of studies for degrees, diplomas and other academic distinctions;
 - conditions governing the appointment and the duties of examiners;
 - (iii) conduct of examinations;
 - (iv) recognition of teachers of the University;
 - (v) the conditions of residence, conduct and discipline of the students of the University;
 - (vi) the recognition of hostels;
 - (vii) the inspection of approved and recognized institutions and hostels;
 - (viii) rules to be observed and enforced by approved and recognized institutions in respect of transfer of students;

- the mode of execution of contracts or agreements for, or on behalf of the University;
- all other matters which, by or under this Act may be required to be provided.
- (2) The Executive Council may make, amend or repeal Ordinances in the manner bereinafter provided.
- (3) No Ordinance concerning the matters referred to in clauses (i) to (viii) of sub-section (1), or any other matter connected with the maintenance of the standards of teaching and examinations within the University, shall be made by the Executive Council unless a draft thereof has been proposed by the Academic Council.
- (4) The Executive Council shall not have the power to amend any draft proposed by the Academic Council under sub-section (3), but may approve the draft Ordinances or either reject or return it to the Academic Council for reconsideration, in whole or in part, together with any amendments which the Executive Council may suggest.
- (5) All Ordinances made by the Executive Council shall have effect from such date as it may direct, but every Ordinance so made shall be submitted to the Chancellor within a period of two weeks. The Chancellor shall have the power to direct the Executive Council, within four weeks of the receipt of the Ordinances, to suspend its operation, and he shall, as soon as possible, inform the Executive Council of his objection to it. He may, after receiving the comments of the Executive Council, either withdraw the order suspending the Ordinances or reject the Ordinances, and his decision shall be final.
- 34. Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Executive Council may Power to make make Regulations consistent with the provisions of this Act to provide regulations. for all or any of the following matters, namely:-
 - constitution of committees for specific purposes, and members and Chairperson of such committee under subsection (11) of section 23;
 - (ii) time, place and period of the meetings of the Academic Council and rules of procedure for transaction of business at such meetings, including the quorum of the meeting under sub-section (3) of section 24;
 - fee for attending the meeting and facilities for travel, transport and accommodation for visits in discharge of function under sub-section (5) of section 28;

- (iv) salary, allowances payable to the Fellow, in accordance with the scheme of Fellowships of the University Grants Commission under sub-section (11) of section 28;
- (v) all other matters which, by or under this Act may be required to be provided.

CHAPTER VIII SUPPLEMENTARY PROVISIONS

Prior 35. (1) The University may with the prior approval of the State approval of Government -

- Government. (a)
 - (a) create any post of a member of the academic or a nonacademic staff of the University and the pay and allowances thereof:
 - (b) divert the use of any earmarked fund for a purpose other than that for which it was originally earmarked;
 - (c) transfer any immovable property belonging to it;
 - (2) The University may incur expenditure from the University Fund and development fund, if any, established by the University for the purpose of—
 - initiating and maintaining any self-financed academic course, and
 - (ii) development work,

with the prior approval of the State Government, if such expenditure imposes financial liability on the State Government.

(3) Notwithstanding anything contained in any Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations, the State Government may lay down a standard code for recruitment and conditions of service of academic and non-academic staff of the University.

Power of State 36. Government to of give directions. the

- 36. (!) Where in the opinion of the State Government, the affairs of the University or institution are carried on in a manner detrimental to the object of the establishment of the University or to its finances or to public interest, the State Government may cause to be made a full and complete investigation into the affairs of the University or institution by appointing a committee for this purpose.
- (2) The committee shall, within a period of one month or such period as the State Government may specify, make a report to the State Government containing recommendations as to the actions to be taken

on the affairs of the University or institution, and steps to prevent carrying on the affairs in the aforesaid manner.

- (3) If the State Government is satisfied that it is desirable to take actions as recommended by the committee, it may issue such directions to the University or institution as may be appropriate in the circumstances.
- (4) Where the University or college or institution fails to carry out any direction given by the State Government, it may withhold the grant to the University or institution.
- There shall be a Standing Committee of the University Standing for the purpose of selection for the posts of professors or such other post Committee. as may be prescribed.
- (2) The standing committee shall consist of the following members, namely:-
 - (a) a retired Judge of the Supreme Court of India or a retired Chief Justice of the Gujarat High Court or an eminent leader of Industry or Commerce or Management, to be nominated by the Chancellor of the University;
 - (b) a retired Chief Secretary, Government of Gujarat, to be nominated by the State Government;
 - (d) a former Vice-Chancellor of a University in Gujarat, to be nominated by the State Government;

The State Government shall nominate one of them as the Chairperson of the Committee.

- (3) For the selection for appointment to the posts of the Registrar and Professors, there shall be a search committee consisting of:-
 - (a) the Vice-Chancellor, ex-officio Chairman; and
 - (b) two members nominated by the Academic Council.
- (4) The search committee shall recommend to the standing committee, three names of suitable candidates along with their bio-data. After scrutinizing the bio-data and, if necessary, after interview of the concerned candidates, the standing committee may select one of them and recommend to the Executive Council for appointment on the concerned post.
- (5) The terms and conditions, the tenure of service and salary, allowances, perks and other facilities of the members of the committee shall be such as may be prescribed by or under this Act.

Resignation 38. membership. and filting up vacancy.

- (1) A member of any authority, other than an ex-officio member. may resign by writing under his signature, addressing to the Chancellor. The person shall cease to be a member upon his resignation being of casual accepted by the Chancelior.
 - If a person nominated, appointed or co-opted to any authority or body remains absent without prior permission of the authority or body for three consecutive meetings; he shall be deemed to have vacated his membership and shall cease to be a member.

No suit shall be instituted against or other legal proceedings shall Indemnity. lie against or no damages shall be claimed from, the University, the authority or officer of the University, in respect of anything which is in good faith done or purported to have been done in pursuance of this Act or the regulations.

Officers, 40. public servant.

- All officers, members of the authorities, committees or bodies, members of members of the academic staff of the University and other employees of authorities, the University, shall be deemed, when acting or purporting to act in employees of pursuance of any of the provision of this Act, to be public servant within XLV or tase. University to be the meaning of section 21 of the Indian Penal Code.
- The State Government may, by notification in the Official Power of State 41. (1) Government to Gazette, make rules generally for carrying out the purposes of this Act. make rules.
 - In particular and without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing powers, such rules may provide for all or any of the following matters, namely :
 - the pay, allowances, emoluments and other terms and conditions of service of the Vice-Chancellor under subsection (3) of section 13;
 - to lay down a standard code for recruitment and (ii) conditions of service of academic and non-academic staff of the University under sub-section (3) of section 35;
 - such other post for which standing committee of the (iii) University shall make selection under sub-section (1) of section 37;
 - the terms and conditions, the tenure of service and salary, allowances, perks and other facilities of the members of the standing committee under sub-section (5) of section 37:
 - All rules made under this section shall be laid for not less than thirty days before the State Legislature as soon as may be after they are made and shall be subject to rescission by the State Legislature or to

such modification as the State Legislature may make during the session in which they are so laid or the session immediately following.

If any difficulty arises in giving effect to the provisions Power to remove of this Act, the State Government may, by order published in the difficulties, Official Gazette, make such provisions not inconsistent with the provisions of this Act as appears to it to be necessary or expedient for removing the difficulty:

Provided that no such order shall be made under this section after the expiry of two years from the commencement of this Act.

Every order made under this section shall be laid as soon as may be after it is made, before the State Legislature.

CHAPTER IX TRANSITORY PROVISIONS

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Act, the first Vice- Appointment of Chancellor shall be appointed by the State Government as soon as first Vicepracticable after the commencement of this Act for a period net Chancellor. exceeding two years and on such terms and conditions as the State Government thinks fit.

- Notwithstanding anything contained in section 16, the first Appointment of Registrar shall be appointed by the State Government as soon as first Registrar. practicable after the commencement of this Act for a period not exceeding two years and on such terms and conditions as the State Government thinks fit.
- It shall be the duty of the first Vice-Chancellor-(1)

Transitory powers of first Vice-Chancellor.

- to give recognition to institutions, if any, as far as possible (a) consistent with the provisions of the Act; and
- to make arrangements for constituting the General Council, (b) the Executive Council, the Academic Council and other authorities of the University within six months after the date of his appointment or such longer period not exceeding one year as the State Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, direct.
- The first Vice-Chancellor shall, with the assistance of the Advisory Committee consisting of not more than fifteen members nominated by the State Government for the purposes of this section,
 - subject to the provisions of this Act, -(a)

- make provisional Statutes necessary for constituting the aforesaid authorities and regulating the procedure at their meetings and the transaction of their business.
- draw up any rules, that may be necessary for regulating the method of constitution of the aforesaid authorities,
- (b) frame the first Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations under this Act and submit them for confirmation to the respective authorities when they commence to exercise their functions.
- (3) The authorities constituted under sub-section (1) shall commence to exercise their functions on such date or dates as the State Government may, by notification in the Official Gazette, direct.
- (4) The Statutes, Ordinances and Regulations framed by the first Vice-Chancellor shall, when confirmed by the respective authorities, be published in the Official Gazette.

First ardinary 46. The first Vice-Chancellor appointed under section 43 shall have powers of first the following powers until the Executive Council commences to exercise it functions -

- (a) with the previous approval of the Chancellor, to make additional Statutes to provide for any matter not provided for by the first Statutes;
- to constitute provisional authorities and bodies and on their recommendations to make rules providing for the conduct of the work of the University;
- (c) subject to the control of the State Government, to make such financial arrangements as may be necessary to enable this Act, or any part thereof, to be brought into force:
- (d) with the sanction of the Chancellor, to make for a period not exceeding three years, such appointments as may be necessary to enable this Act or any part thereof, to be brought into force;
- to appoint any committee as he may thinks fit, to discharge such of its functions as he may direct; and
- (f) generally to exercise all or any of the powers conferred on the Executive Council by or under the provisions of this Act.

At any time after the commencement of this Act, until First such time as the authorities of the University shall commence to exercise appointment of their functions, -

officers of University.

- the Vice-Chancellor with the previous sanction of the (a) State Government may appoint any officer of the University:
- till the Executive Council is constituted, the teachers of (b) the University may be appointed by the Advisory Committee referred to in sub-section (2) of section 45 with the approval of the State Government on the recommendation of the Selection Committee consisting of the following persons, namely :
 - the Vice-Chancellor,
 - (ii) a nominee of the State Government,
 - (iii) three experts to be appointed out of a panel of experts drawn by the Advisory Committee.
- Any appointment made under sub-section (1) shall be for such period not exceeding three years and on such terms and conditions as the appointing authority thinks fit:

Provided that no such appointment shall be made until financial provision has been made therefore.

આ વિચારથી પ્રેરાઈને આંતરરાષ્ટ્રીય માતૃભાષા દિવસે ભારતીય શિક્ષક પ્રશિક્ષણ સંસ્થાનનાં સેન્ટર ઓફ એક્સટેન્શન અંતર્ગત ત્રિદિવસીય ભાષામહોત્સવ - 'ભાષામંજૂષા'ની ઊજવણી થઈ. કપરા કોરોનાકાળ પછી વિદ્યાર્થીઓથી ફરી એક્વાર કેમ્પસ ધબકતું થયું ત્યાં જ ભાષાપ્રેમથી છલકાતા આ મહોત્સવનું આયોજન દિનાંક ૨૧, ૨૨, ૨૩ ફેબ્રુઆરી, ૨૦૨૧ દરમિયાન થયું, રાજ્યના નામાંકિત ભાષાવિદ્યો, યુવા લેખકો, વક્તાઓ અને કવિઓ દ્વારા વૈવિધ્યસભર વિષયો પર વ્યાખ્યાન, સંવાદસત્રો અને ચર્ચાસત્રોનું આયોજન કરવામાં આવ્યું હતું. પ્રથમ દિવસે ફેસબ્રુકના માધ્યમથી ઓનલાઇન તથા બે દિવસ યુનિવર્સિટીના પ્રાંગલમાં માતૃભાષામાં ધબકાર ધબક્યા

માતૃભાષા પ્રેમ માત્ર આ ત્રણ દિવસના મહોત્સવ સુધી જ મર્યાદિત ન બની રહે, તે સુનિશ્ચિત કરવા માટે આઈઆઈટીઈના માન. કુલપતિશ્રી હૉ. હર્ષદ પટેલની પ્રેરણા અને માર્ગદર્શનથી યુનિવર્સિટીના સેન્ટર ઓફ એક્સ્ટેન્શન અંતર્ગત 'ભારતીય ભાષા અને સંસ્કૃતિ વિભાગ' નો પ્રારંભ કરવામાં આવ્યો છે. આ કેન્દ્રમાં ભારતીય બંધારણમાં સમાવિષ્ટ તમામ 22 પ્રાદેશિક ભાષાઓ ઉપરાંત પ્રાકૃત, પાલી અને ભારતીય અંગ્રેજી ભાષાઓમાં અભ્યાસ અને તેના સાહિત્ય અને સંસ્કૃતિનું અધ્યયન થઈ શકશે. આ વિભાગના સંયોજક તરીકેની જવાબદારી કુ. રાધા મહેતાને સોંપવામાં આવી છે.

આંતરરાષ્ટ્રીય માતૃભાષા દિવસ એટલે કે 21 ફેબ્રુઆરીના રોજ ફેસબુકના માધ્યમથી 'ભાષામંજૂષા'નો પ્રારંભ થયો. જેમાં આ ત્રિદિવસીય મહોત્સવની પરિકલ્પનાનો ચિતાર આઈઆઈટીઈના રાધા મહેતાએ આપ્યો. માત્ર ગુજરાત નહિ, વિશ્વભરના ગુજરાતીઓના હૃદયમાં અંકિત એવું નામ, આરજે (રેડિયો જોકી) દેવકીની વિશેષ ઉપસ્થિતિ રહી. ગળથૂથીમાં જ મળેલા ભાષા અને સાહિત્યના વારસાની વાતો કરતાં દેવકીએ જણાવ્યું કે એક વક્તા, અભિનેત્રી તરીકે તેમના ઘડતરમાં માતૃભાષામાં મળેલા શિક્ષણ અને વિચાર પ્રક્રિયાનો ખૂબ મોટો ફાળો છે. તેમણે જણાવ્યું હતું કે, "આપણે જે ભાષામાં ગુસ્સો કરીએ, રડીએ એ આપણી માતૃભાષા છે. માટું શિક્ષણ ગુજરાતી માધ્યમમાં જ થયું અને તેને કારણે જ મને ગુજરાતી સાહિત્ય અને સંસ્કૃતિનો વારસો સમજવા અને માણવા મળ્યો."

આઈઆઈટીઈના વડા માન. કુલપતિશ્રી ડૉ. હર્ષદ પટેલે દ્વારા આ પર્વની ઉજવણી વિશે શુભેચ્છાઓ આપી. તેમણે આંતરરાષ્ટ્રીય માતૃભાષા દિવસે આઈઆઈટીઈના સેન્ટર ઓફ એક્સ્ટેન્શન અંતર્ગત ભારતીય ભાષા અને સંસ્કૃતિ વિભાગની ઘોષણા કરતા જણાવ્યું. "રાષ્ટ્રીય શિક્ષણ નીતિ 2020માં ભારતીય ભાષાઓના શિક્ષણ અને તેમના મારફતે આપણા દેશના વૈવિધ્વપૂર્ણ સાંસ્કૃતિક વારસાના જતન અને સંવર્ધન પર ભાર મુકવામાં આવ્યો છે. આઈઆઈટીઈ ગુજરાતમાં છે, પરંત તેમાં ભારતના વિવિધ રાજ્યોમાંથી એક ડઝનથી વધ અલગ અલગ પ્રાદેશિક ભાષાઓ બોલતાં વિદ્યાર્થીઓ અભ્યાસ કરે છે. એટલું જ નહીં. યુનિવર્સિટીના સેન્ટર ઓફ એજ્યુકેશનમાં તેલુગ. આસામી, મરાઠી, જેવી માતૃભાષા ધરાવતા અધ્યાપકો કાર્યરત્ છે. આ ઉપરાંત યુનિવર્સિટી કેમ્પસથી નજીકના શહેર અમદાવાદમાં લગભગ ભારતની મોટાભાગની પ્રાદેશિક ભાષાઓ બોલતા લોકે વસે છે. આથી આઈઆઈટીઈમાં અભ્યાસ કરવા આવનારા વિદ્યાર્થીઓને અને બૃહદ સમાજમાં પોતાના વતનથી દૂર વસતા નાગરિકો પોતાના માટે અને પોતાના સંતાનો માટે તેમની માતૃભાષામાં બોલતા, લખતાં, વાંચતા શીખે અને તેમના સાંસ્કૃતિક મૂળ સાથેનો તેમનો સંબંધ સઘન બને તે હેતુથી આ વિભાગનો પ્રારંભ કરવામાં આવ્યો છે."



તારીખ ૨૨ તથા ૨૩ના રોજ આઈ.આઈ.ટી.ઈ.ના આંગણે ભાષામંજૂષામાંથી ગુજરાતી ભાષાના ઝળહળતા સાહિત્ય રત્નોનો મેળાવડો જામ્યો. પ્રખર શિક્ષણવિદ્ અને વક્તા, હો. ભદ્રાયુ વછરાજાની દ્વારા સવાયા ગુજરાતીઓ વિષય પર અત્યંત રસપ્રદ વક્તવ્ય અપાયું. વિવિધ પુસ્તકોને સાથે રાખીને તેમણે ગુજરાતી સાહિત્યના એવા દિગ્ગજોને ટાંકી બતાવ્યા જેઓ જન્મે ગુજરાતી નથી અને છતાં ગુજરાતીને માતૃભાષા સરીખો પ્રેમ કર્યો અને મોકળા મને ગુજરાતી સાહિત્યની લ્હાણી કરી. ભારતીય અને બિનભારતીય ગુજરાતી સાહિત્યકારોની શૈલીનું વૈવિધ્ય પણ દર્શાવ્યું અને એવાં અનેક પુસ્તકોની વાત કરી જે ભવિષ્યના શિક્ષકો માટે વૈચારિક ઊંડાણ આપનારા હોય.



પર માતૃભાષા જેટલું પ્રભુત્વ ધરાવી શકે તો ગુજરાતી ભાષામાં ઉછરેલી વ્યક્તિ સવાવા મરાઠી કે સવાવા સ્પેનીશ કેમ ન બની શકે! આવા કંઇક વિચારબીજની ફલશ્રુતિ સ્વરૂપ બીજું સેશન રહ્યું. ગુજરાતીમાંથી મરાઠી અને મરાઠીમાંથી ગુજરાતી સાહિત્યિક અનુવાદ માટે ખ્યાતનામ મૂળે મરાદી પણ કર્મે ગુજરાતી કવિ, નાટ્યકાર અને ગઝલકાર શ્રી મકરંદ મુસળે તથા તેમના આત્મજા સોશિયલ મીડિયા પર ગુજરાતી અને મરાઠી, બંને ભાષામાં યુવાનોને આકર્ષે અને રૂચી જન્માવે એવું હળવાશભર્યું કન્ટેન્ટ બનાવી પ્રસિદ્ધિ પામનાર, મંચ અને મીડિયા બંને સાથે સંકળાયેલાં નૈસર્ગી મુસળેએ દ્વિતીય સત્રમાં સુંદર વાર્તાલાપ કર્યો. તેમની સાથે રાધા મહેતાએ સંવાદ સાધ્યો. "સદા સૌમ્ય શી વૈભવે ઉભરાતી, મળી મને માતૃભાષા ગુજરાતી." શ્રી ઉમાશંકર જોશીની આ પંક્તિઓ સાથે "લાભલે આમ્હાસ ભાગ્ય બોલતો મરાદી"નું અનુસંધાન થયું, ગુજરાતી અને મરાઠી, એમ બે માનો પ્રેમ જેમને મળ્યો એવા ત્રણ વ્યક્તિઓ વચ્ચેના સંવાદે હળવી શૈલીમાં ભાવિના શિક્ષકોને એકથી વધારે ભાષા પર મહારથ હાંસલ કરવા પ્રેર્યા.

ભાષા અને સાહિત્યના આ ઉત્સવમાં ભાષાના એક આગવા અને અભિન્ન અંગ સમી વિષય 'સિનેમા' પર ઘોજાયો "સિને-સંવાદ". ગુજરાતી સિનેમા જગતના ઝળહળતા તારક, ટી.વી. અને સ્ક્રીન રાઇટર, ગુજરાતી ભાષાના સૌથી યુવા વયના યુવા ગૌરવ પુરસ્કાર વિજેતા લેખક શ્રી રામ મોરી આ સત્રના મુખ્ય વક્તા રહ્યા. તળપદી ગુજરાતી શૈલીમાં તેમણે ગુજરાતના ગામડાંગામ સુધી પહોંચેલી સિનેમાની ગુજરાતી ભાષાની વાતો કરી તો આધુનિક ગુજરાતી સિનેમા જગતનો ચિતાર આપીને પોતાનો આશાવાદ રજૂ કર્યો. એમનાં જ શબ્દોમાં કહીએ તો ગુજરાતી સિનેમા થકી ભાષાની જીવંતતા માટે "એ બહુ હોપફૂલ છે અને એમના હોપમાં એચ કેપિટલ છે."

'ભાષામંજૂયા'ના સૌથી યુવા વક્તા બિરદ છાયાએ એંશીના દાયકાની ગુજરાતી ફિલ્મો "કંકુ" અને "કાશીનો દીકરો"ની પણ વાતો કરી અને સિનેમાને સાહિત્યનો અભિન્ન હિસ્સો હોવાની રજૂઆત કરી. સત્ર પૂરું કરતાં રાધા મહેતાએ સંસ્કૃત કાવ્યશાસનું અવતરણ ટાંકીને સિનેમાને "દ્રશ્ય સાહિત્ય"નું સાંપ્રત સ્વરૂપ ગણાવીને ભાષાપ્રેમથી છલકાતા આ મહોત્સવમાં સિને-સંવાદની યથાર્થતા બતાવી.

મધ્યાહ્ન પછીનો કાર્યક્રમ વિદ્યાર્થીઓની રંગારંગ અભિવ્યક્તિનો રહ્યો. ભારતીય શિક્ષક પ્રશિક્ષણ સંસ્થાનનું વૈશિષ્ટ્ય એ ભારતભરના વિદ્યાર્થીઓનું એક સ્થાને સમન્વય છે. આથી જ વિદ્યાર્થીઓની માતૃભાષા પણ વેગવેગળી છે. વાત જ્યારે અભિવ્યક્તિની હોય ત્યારે અભિવ્યક્તિને શિક્ષણના એક સશક્ત માધ્યમ તરીકે શીખનારા આઈઆઈટીઈના વિદ્યાર્થીઓ જરાય પાછળ નથી હોતા. માત્ર ત્રણ દિવસના ટુંકા સમયગાળામાં પણ આઈઆઈટીઈમાં

અભ્યાસ કરનારા સંખ્યાબંધ વિદ્યાર્થીઓએ 'સંગતની રંગત' સત્રમાં કુલ 11 માતૃભાષામાં સંગીત, સ્વરચિત કાવ્ય, લોકસાહિત્યની રમઝટ પ્રસ્તુત કરવા વિદ્યાર્થીઓએ અપ્રતિમ ઉત્સાહ દર્શાવ્યો અને દરેક પ્રસ્તુતિને હોંશથી વધાવી લેવામાં પ્રેક્ષકોએ પણ કચાશ ન રાખી. રાષ્ટ્રીય શિક્ષણનીતિ તથા સુપ્રયિત રાષ્ટ્રના મૂલ્યને અનુસંગત એવા સંસ્કૃતિક એકીકરણના દેષ્ટાંતરૂપ આ કાર્યક્રમ રહ્યો. આ સાથે જ પ્રયમ દિવસની પૂર્શાહૃતિ થઈ.

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Report of One Day National Seminar on New National Education Policy, 2019

One-day National Seminar on New National Education Policy 2019 was organised at IITE, Gandhinagar in collaboration and sponsorship of Savitribai Phule Pune University, Pune on 28th June, 2019. The programme schedule is attached in Annexure 1.

The inaugural session began with the lighting of lamp and invocation prayer.



The inaugural address was delivered by Dr. Harshad Patel, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor of IITE, Gandhinagar. He highlighted the important points of the New National Education Policy 2019 and further advocated for four-year integrated teacher education programme for quality teachers.



The key note address was delivered by Prof. Maheshchandra Yagnik, Retd. Professor, Department of Education, Sardar Patel University, Vallabh Vidyanagar and Former Director HRDC, VV Nagar who highlighted on quality of education since the British time period. Prof. Yagnik spoke on the concept of the education and pointed out that education offered by the Britishers was of lower standard. It taught skills that would require Indian students always to work under the supervision of someone.



Professor Maheshchandra Yagnik then narrated examples of three language formula, importance of mother tongue and regional language at primary level. He stated examples from Sadler Commission. He also related it with the recommendations of Wood's Despatch and Rammurthy commission by suggesting way to bring a sea-change in Education field.

Finally, Sir spoke about the important years of 1998 and 2015 when important educational matters got into discussion. The scenario of then and present was compared. Prof. strongly felt that contemplation is yet required for the teaching fraternity to lucidly present the matters of quality maintenance in teaching pedagogy and research. The willingness and moral ethics of teachers which he pointed are: To be honest and develop their contents to developing core knowledge from textbooks rather than guide books. To get exposed for a longer duration for the content of their subjects.

Plenary – 1 Session Guest Speaker Dr. Mahndra Chotalia on the theme: "Moving teacher education to multidisciplinary colleges and universities."

Dr. Chotalia began his presentation by pointing out that the New Education Policy was in the testing phase and would be beneficial for new teachers and those who want to become teachers. He proceeded by throwing light on some important points in the new policy as follows –

♣ Under the new policy, primary and higher education would be in synchrony/harmony and continuity.

- The policy focuses on 'Bharat nu Gyan' and 'Bharat kendrit shikshan' and its aim is to establish a knowledgeable society.
- ♣ The policy also focuses on productive citizenship, scientific bent of mind, 'Kala soundarya bodh' and 'Sarjansheelta'.
- ♣ A welcome point in the new policy that would bring a sea-change is that vocational training will be based on liberal studies.
- Focus on mother-tongue, local languages and bi-/multilingualism; training in languages will begin from preschool (3-8 age groups)
- Introduction to Indian heritage, history and Sanskrit language
- ♣ Point 15.2 focuses on bringing Education departments into multidisciplinary colleges and universities.

Dr. Chotalia pointed out that the present day teacher educators are isolated and unaware of what kind of teaching, research and training programs are conducted in various other universities and colleges. To curb this isolation, the teacher educators need to be exposed to the new subjects, methods and techniques followed in other institutions to make it a multidisciplinary approach. The aspiration of the policy is 'total quality education', to create more professional teacher educators with multidisciplinary knowledge, vision and context. For this, according to Dr. Chotalia, 'Bahuvishayak' institutions are required which will help develop multidisciplinary approach. A 'teaching attitude' needs to be developed and a minimum of 4 years is required to develop the attitude, hence the policy has proposed a 4-year training program. Single stream colleges will be closed in order to encourage multidisciplinary approach. NCTE will dissolve. PSSB (Professional Standard Setting Bodies) will be established to set standards for teacher education. NTA to conduct entrance tests based on aptitude for all university and college admissions. B.Ed. to be renamed as Dual Major Liberal Bachelor Degree.

Plenary Session-2 Guest Speaker- Dr. H.B.Patel, Topic-NEP – A Critical Review focusing on Teacher's Education

Prof. Patel, started the session with the discussion that we are here not for criticism but assembled to add suggestions to bring neither negative nor positive but **a balanced** approach in the NPE as the situations will vary. The **Chapter-15 of Teacher's Education** mentions about the changes and in small portion about it the mention is in **Ch-5**. Prof. H.B. Patel even discussed about the objectives behind teacher education:

- To develop a **multidisciplinary approach** in the field of education. The main reason behind it is that to fill in the gap between the demand and supply chain there should be an integration of all the professionals from various fields into education.
- ♣ The reason that it should be 4 years to give more exposure to teachers to develop the skills and collaborate different techniques in practice.
- The **background** of why colleges offering B.Ed, degree were closed, sub-standard levels of education, corrupt dues to mal-practices, having limited visions, and due limited programmes.

- He emphasised on discussing why choice-based system or credit based system came into use and was popular. As in abroad there are many countries which have a common consortium for at least 2 years of bachelor's degree. So in future due to **shortage of skill** in foreign countries as there is an increasing demand for teachers. This is an opportunity for many in education field who can by having multi-disciplinary subjects which the NEP talks can opt for better opportunities.
- Earlier B.Ed. was offered in isolation in colleges of Education only, Dr. H. B. Patel spoke about NEP in terms of now B.Ed. would be offered along with a **variety of courses**. With this 2 way approach it would benefit both the student and the institute for its survival opportunities.
- Sir spoke on the matter that the policy also lists out that the colleges are to **create** a new department if it does not exist as a department in the college. As well to merge the diploma courses in Department of Education.
- The guest speaker as well pointed on the fact that NEP also suggests that in future there will be **review** done on courses as per demand and such courses will start through exam based entry.
- ♣ NHEA will every 3 months review course to suggest suitable changes with relevant feedback. The 4 years integrated B.Ed. courses can in future be called Dual major liberal Bachelor's degree to have multidisciplinary approach.
- ♣ NTA in future will decide on most of competitive exam entry of students in courses and jobs. But the criteria of how many students to intake for admission on the colleges and universities.
- The NEP also suggests on **continuous up gradation** of teacher's through in service, pre-service and CPD training as well as higher education faculty training consistently.
- For the **mode** of these courses as full time, part-time, face to face or evening programme it offers flexibility and yet we need to contemplate on the same.
- ♣ Analysis every 5 years would indicate the demand and supply curve in the field of education. M.Phil. will be no more. But the core subject's knowledge necessitates at least one degree in Education.
- Those with **supplementary** degrees from other streams who want to pursue teaching profession would need to know pedagogy hence B.Ed. is required.
- Ph.D. is not mandatory but the experience in research is required in the field of education. Those with **B.Sc. background** or with 50% industries need to do one degree in education. As well 30% of the load of the guide the student needs to shoulder as **teaching assistantship** in class.
- In future **HRDC** is to **merge** in department of education or create it as a separate big department alone. The concerned teachers in future would be at 3 levels- centre, state, and joint secretary level would be RSA.
- The **change** is enviable part in the future so acceptance would be required. We can suggest ways to accept it in a balanced manner. To act seriously on it.
- These changes can in future cut down or **reduce** the number of intake of students in huge numbers. This could even reduce the number of colleges thus integrated programme could only run in few institutes as per the demand of the courses in the

- education field. This requires induction, orientation into **DIET programmes** to reduce the work.
- Lastly Professor Patel **concluded** that the supply will also result in creating its own demand. Thus more components based courses with come into existence. Thus B.Ed. course as per the policy can be no longer called B.Ed but **skill based courses**.

Plenary Session-3 Guest Speaker Dr. Bharat Joshi, Registrar I/c, Professor/ Dean/ Director-Faculty of Education Gujarat Vidyapith Ahmedabad, Gujarat on the theme: Restoring Integrity to Teacher Education



Dr. Joshi, addressed to and discussed some of his concerns regarding the draft on new education policy, as follows:

- The timing of introducing the new draft on education policy should be understood. Why immediately after the conclusion of General Parliamentary Election, the draft copy was issued?
- Was the draft ready in advance? What is the agenda reflected within the draft copy?
- **4** Government's concerns regarding the overall education in India.
- ♣ The impact of governance on education.
- **Education** as nurturing the human resource.
- How can Teacher Education be brought to appropriate force and functioning with the new merger in integrated form.
- ♣ Majority of changes in the education policies after 1986 was brought to effect in the last five years, but unfortunately the reasons behind the changes have not been brought to the light.
- The integrated programme of four years- its implementation and prior challenges for the existing system should be taken into consideration.
- What nature of functioning will be offered to the grant-in-aid colleges, already functioning at local level?
- While concluding, Dr. Joshi expressed deep sense of gratitude for the efforts and responsibility shared by IITE so far in gathering the best of suggestions and best practices, which may be implemented with reference to the coming "change".

Plenary Session-4 Guest Speaker Dr. Satish Prakash Shukla, Professor, Department of Education, Gujarat University, Ahmedabad on the theme Faculty for Teacher Education



Prof Shukla in his session highlighted that the faculty for teacher education is a matter of great concern. There is a lack of understanding towards conceptual knowledge among teachers. So the fraternity needs to develop conceptual clarity with an understanding of logic behind each concept. Student teachers have an uncertain understanding of microteaching skills, general objectives and other such terms. It becomes difficult for them to differentiate between microteaching skills and teaching skills. The concept of integrated programs is proposed to ensure that during the teacher education programs the teacher need to teach content in such a way that they are able to correlate the content and pedagogy. The new policy under faculty for teacher education proposes faculty with the specialization in the area of curriculum and pedagogy, foundation areas of educational technology and research in teacher education will be required as core educators. Core faculty is supplemented by the faculty with masters and Ph.D. degree in various related disciplines as science, education, psychology, cognitive studies, human development and many other disciplines. He further said that Bhutan is a small country but is considered to have an education system better than that of India. There is a need to keep an ongoing learning attitude as teacher educators only then we can ask students to keep the learning attitude. There is a need to teach students not only how to look for the concept but also how to teach them. Concerns have been raised about the issues that may arise with the introduction of the New National Education Policy and proactive efforts should be made to tackle them.

Valedictory session, Guest Speaker Prof. Bhadrayu Vachhrajani, Retd. Professor, Former Director, ASC, Saurashtra University, Rajkot



Valedictory session started with university song. After university song, reports of all four plenary sessions were presented by all the reporter of plenary sessions viz. Dr. Swarnabharati for session I, Ms. Smita Gadhvi for session II, Dr. Deep Trivedi for session III, Dr. Divya Sharma for session IV.

This was followed by **Feedback session** in which Dr. Sanjay Thaker, Principal, M. N. Shukla College of Education and Dr. S.P. Sharma from Patan gave their valuable feedback as Teacher Educator. Dr. Sanjay Thaker felt happy for existence of faculty of Teacher Education as a discipline as Education faculty has its own identity, which was failed by our ancestor to give due importance. He focused on accountability, as there are many agencies to test the individual and take interview to those who come to attend without preparation 'How one can teach our next generation without preparation. Therefore, what is the need of these agencies? On the other hand,



Dr. Sharma focused on the importance of languages i.e. English, Hindi, and Gujarati; appreciate the chapter-wise distribution of content and show concerned about the next generation, mental adjustment for the changes to be done, and management of the human

resources. For all these concerns, she concluded that we have to think more and more about the need of future generation and contributed significantly to convert draft of New National Education Policy -2019' to its final form.

Valedictory address by Bhadrayu Vacchrajani, Retd. Professor and Former Director, ASC, Saurashtra University, Rajkot. He laid stress on the importance of Teacher Education in policy making and showed concern about the place of students, teachers, parents and Authority in the policy and criticize the word given in the draft i.e. 'Kachramukti' means the dual standard college must be shut down.

He compared the education system of India and Finland; TET/ TAT and B.Ed. degree-which one counts? Theoretical knowledge and practical knowledge- need to fill the educational gap and provide quality education by upgrading the necessary things and diluting the unnecessary one. He left with one question 'Shall we able to run integrated college?' and at last he appreciated the initiative taken by IITE to discuss about the New National Education Policy.

Chair's Address by Dr. Harshad A. Patel, Hon'ble Vice Chancellor, IITE, Gandhinagar. During his speech, he presented four years integrated programme as a game changer programme in future and ensure that new changes occur due to determination. We have to accept the change in a positive way and prepare ourselves for that. We have to take initiative to lead to bring changes or to improve the quality of Teacher Education. For that we have to do clean up exercise as well because change always done at grassroot level and IITE take lead for that.



The one day seminar came to an end with the **Vote of thanks** by Dr. Divya Sharma, Associate Professor, IITE, Gandhinagar to HRDC Savitribai Phule Pune University, and all the Speakers, Participants, Registrar, Principal, HODs, IITE Staff and supporting staff.







"Do you feel any trouble in day to day life?" with such question and a small activity mentors introduced the PBL place to the students and shared that with all senses we sometimes behave like disable and the place where we are going there you would find different story than yours. So answer the question after the visit.

On 8th Mar 2017, Wednesday, students started their visit to Andh kanya Prakash Gruh situated behind manav manidr, memnagar, Ahmedabad. As scheduled earlier students had finished their lunch in the college around 11.30 AM. Then they gathered at bus near by 12.15 PM. Rameshbhai was with us as a driver, bus no. GJ 18 AZ 1432. Mentor Mrs. Tresia Paul, Ms. Sapna Mishra, Ms. Hiral Mehta and Ms. Kalindi Jadav joined the visit.

Originally visit was arranged ar 10.30 am but due to women's day celebration our visit was postponed at 1.30 PM. We reached the institute at 1.20 PM, that is before time. Celebration was near to end. Prize distribution was going on. Our students saw the girls and were amazed to see these girls walking and doing their work very normally like them without any regret on their face or in heart

Andh Kanya Prakash Gruh - the school cares for approximately 200 visually impaired girls. It offers lodging and boarding and in-house facilities in Braille education up to Class VII. For further studies up to Board level and for Bachelor and Masters degrees, girls attend local schools and colleges meant for sighted students. The main objective is to impart education to visually

impaired girls. They should develop into responsible citizens of India. They should also be given an opportunity to lead an independent life.

After the program was finished AKPG's girls went for lunch. Here our students sat and started discussing about the work they need to undertake and questions they need to ask. By 2 PM one of their faculty came to us and introduced students about the institute. Then one by one students entered the campus in group.

First, we saw the Girl's Hostel. In every room there were 4 beds. Most of the girls stay in the hostel. There was a notice board, on which notices were written in braille script.

From there we headed towards the backyard of campus which was not just the backyard but the special learning zone for the blind students. Where there was garden with slopes. So blind girls can understand the sloppy and flat surface. Also there were different statute of animal. Where those girls touch and feel and understand that how animal could look. Also they have made a bus stations demo, where the girls were taught how bus arrives, how they need to buy tickets and also how to stand in queue. There was miniature of everything. As these girls can't see anything but they can definitely feel everything.

From here, we went to individual classrooms. In Std:1, Hindi class was going on, where girls were giving their introduction in Hindi. As we entered these kids counted from 30 to 50 in Hindi. Our students were holding hands and talking to those kids.

In Std:2, girls were singing poem on Holi. They also sung another poem for us. In Std:4, English class was going on. There girls were reading the paragraph. We were amazed by the speed by which they were reading. Their books were in braille.

From there we went to computer lab. In computer lab, they were having a software which was helping them to work on computers. The computer Page 326

speaks as kids press any key or if there is any mistake the computer says itself. Here, these girls need to remember the keys and their exact location. By, which typing speed also increases.

From here we went to the class of home science where girls were cooking. We were surprised by seeing two blind girls making chapatti and cutting the veggies. As they finished cooking, every one of us tasted the food. It was yummy in taste. As students were tasting and praising girl's skills, girls were happy and felt motivated. Another group went to some girls and started singing group song. By which we also came to know that these girls are aware about current trends and movies and songs.

At the entrance there was a workshop where few girls were making handicraft items like, bracelets, necklace, and other ornaments by stones and other materials. Here our few students bought some necklace and bracelets too.

At the end of the visit, our students gasped in surprise. They got the answer of the question which their mentors asked them in the orientation, with absence of one sense if these girls lead their life with spirit and joy why can't we? No excuse now onwards we will accelerate our efforts for leading the life.

With the small game teachers started the PBL orientation process for 4th Type PBL - Special Child Institute. Where teachers selected 3 students from the class, sent them out of the class and then given instruction to rest of the class- not to support the three of them when they enter in class and try to do certain task. Teacher assigned 3 tasks to 3 students, among 3 one had to play the role of Blind person, one was Dumb and one had to play the role of handicapped person having no right hand. Tasks for three were - Blind student had to enter in the class and reach up to the last bench of right corner, Dumb student had to ask for the syllabus of biology and handicapped had to weave the choti of her friend with only one hand. All were curious, supportive and trying to know what and why was happening. With this small game teacher introduced the subject of Special Child and their life and conditions in front of the students and orient the students for the Special Child Institute Visit.

Under this PBL 4th Semester's 46 students are supposed to visit BPA- Blind
People Association – BPA - ONE WINDOW SERVICE FOR PERSONS
WITH DISABILITIES. Blind People's Association is a professional
organization which believes in providing equal opportunities to all categories
of people with disabilities. Consistent with the philosophy, it works for
providing education, employment opportunities, equal rights and quality life
for them.

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On 10th April 2017 at 8.30 am bus – Driver Chandansinh (bus no : GJ18 G 8646) started from Hostel for the visit. Due to youth festival preparation 12 students were absent in the PBL. With 3 Faculty members Ms. Hiral Mehta, Ms. Jayati Brahmbhatt and Ms. Divya Shah students started the visit for BPA. They reached there by 9.45 am. Ms. Sharda was the coordinator for the campus visit. As soon as students reached there Shardaben came down and introduced all to Mr. Dave who took the students on campus visit.

Visit started with short introduction of BPA and then followed by visit of Kaushalya Vardhan Kendra. Where students saw printing, tailoring and textile printing units.

They saw the printing press where deaf dumb and other physically challenged people were working. They work on their own and earn money which helps them to survive and feed themselves. This shows the level of self-respect and dedication these people have.

After that students visited the IT lab. They saw blind students and their daily life struggle, yet they were so strong and stubborn about their life. Their positivity was very strong that it felt to us straight. Their admiration of work was really excellent and bar grace.

After IT lab visit all students went to the main attraction of BPA – "Vision In the Dark" - the museum aims primarily to sensitize those with sight about how those without sight manage their daily lives. It will give visitors experience of being blind. It will help them understand that there is no need to pity blind but be sensitive to their needs.

The museum houses models of different gods, national and international leaders, temple, mosque, church and a village. The only thing is that it is pitch dark and the visitors are blinded to the visual. The visitors can sense Page 332 the changes in their environment and decipher what exactly could be around

them or happening around them. Each statue has Braille marking and audio sensor.

As the visitors pass from one idol to the other, the sensor senses the movement and changes the music track, changes the audio with different surroundings. If the visitors are standing near statue of Mahatma Gandhi, the audio will play either his speech or the bhajan favourite of Mahatma. Similarly, if the visitors move on to other statue of Subhash Chandra Bose, the audio will change to his speech or song of Indian National Army.

The experience is so disconcerting for a person with sight. It hits the visitors hard as they only hear sounds and smell surroundings. Many people just freeze at the first step and only when assisted by visually impaired are they able to move ahead. It is only after moving around the pavilion for a few minutes does one get insight in to the real world of being visually impaired. It was wonderful experience for all the students that one hour in dark.

Having a cup of Tea and a plate of Poha at blind School Canteen students were sharing their experience of visit. They realized the real potential within themselves, also the limitations they have created at their own in their mind and decided to come out of it. After the visit near 3 pm all started back for the hostel with memories of BPA.

- In the feedback session, the people presented their photographs and received helpful tips and advice from the mentor.




E- Content generation & Curriculum Development Workshop




Description





Topic: Priorities in Educational Research

The first session was by Prof. R. G. Kothari on the topic <u>'Priorities in Educational Research'</u>. There is a famous saying in Gujarati that "કુવામા ફોય, તો ફવાડામાં આવે" but today there was an ocean of knowledge came together in one place. Surely it depends on listeners that as a container that how much we absorb from this opportunity.

Prof. Kothari focused mainly on three points that are as follow, the purpose of research, the establishment of relationship among the variables and on generation of some knowledge.

Prof. Kothari sir also gave stress on concerns quoted by NCF, NPE & UNICEF while suggesting for possible research areas.






