Dr. Jagdishchandra Gothi. Their presence added prestige to the event, emphasizing the importance of sports in holistic education.













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The Centre of Research, organized NVivo Workshop on Qualitative Data Analysis on 06/01/2024 at 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.The workshop began with rendering the university song and lighting the lamp. Dr. Viral Jadav, Director, Centre of Research, IITE, Gandhinagar served as advisor and as Convener for this workshop and talked about the endeavours taken by Center of Research, IITE. Dr. Dhaval Mehta, Professor in Department of Business and Industrial Management at VNSGU, Surat, served as the expert for the workshop.

Professor Prerana Shelat was the chief guest of inaugural session and talked about the importance of research. Dr. Yesha Bhatt, Research Assistant has anchored all the sessions.

As a teacher training institute, this initiative aimed to enrich learners' knowledge in the aforementioned areas, recognizing that the construction of tools in qualitative research is pivotal for ensuring the depth, richness, and trustworthiness of the study. Qualitative research relies on carefully designed and developed tools, such as interview guides and open-ended surveys, to capture nuanced insights and perspectives. It is crucial that these tools are thoughtfully crafted to elicit meaningful responses and contribute to a comprehensive understanding of the variables of interest.

This Workshop received a great deal of attention and commendable responses from research scholars and research supervisors. A total 50 participants from various Institutes were registered (from which 43 were attended the workshop). The workshop fees were 600/- INR but if was free for the research scholars and staff members of CoR.





#### Discussion:

1.Session-1(11:00 am to 1:00 pm): This session was engaged on the basic difference of quantitative and qualitative data analysis and the elements to analyse qualitative data. The expert explained the process of quotation, codes and themes with the importance of 'context' along with hands-on practice.

2.Session-2(2:00 pm to 4:00 pm): In this Session, topic was matrix coding sub-coding and word cloud along with interpretation of frequency and codes. The expert took a small practical test by randomly choosing participants to tell the process of the coding taught during the session.

3.Session-3(4:00 pm to 5:00 pm): This session was focused on addressing questions and clearing doubts.

In conclusion, the NVivo workshop on qualitative data analysis has proven to be an invaluable experience, providing participants with a comprehensive understanding of the software's capabilities. Through hands-on exercises and guided tutorials, attendees gained proficiency in coding, organizing, and analysing qualitative data efficiently. As researchers increasingly rely on qualitative methods, NVivo emerges as a powerful tool that empowers them to unlock deeper meanings within their data, ultimately enhancing the rigor and validity of their qualitative analyses. The interactive format of the workshop also allowed for a productive exchange of ideas and feedback among the attendees.

The participant's queries were very well clarified by the resource persons and feedback form collected from the participants after completion of workshop. In the feedback, around 80% of the participants have mentioned that the the quality of the content, relevance of the provided information and usefulness was of superioir level. More then 95% of the attendees have showed interest in the additional information on this topic, more than 70% of attendees have admired the enthusiasm and knowledge of the presenter. all the attendees have mentioned that they would join similar programmes organized by CoR and appreciated the conduct of staff. The organizing committee members Dr. Yesha Bhatt, Mr. Kaustubh Upadhyay and Ms. Afsana Savant have worked with dedication in the overall organization of the workshop. The workshop was ended by Vote of Thanks by the Convener Dr. Viral Jadav. Certificates were issued by the department after successful completion of the program.

To celebrate it with a difference center of special education under its project SAMBHAV:-Stakeholder Awareness for Multiple Disability & amp; Behavioral Adaptation organized one-day hand-on workshop on Braille for teacher-trainees. The theme of this years World Braille Day emphasized on " Empowering Through Inclusion and Diversity", which highlights the commitment to creating a world where individuals with visual impairments are not only recognized but fully included in all aspects of society. It emphasizes the transformative power of embracing diversity within the visually impaired community and advocates for an inclusive environment that enables everyone, regardless of their abilities, to thrive and contribute meaningfully. This day is celebrated annually to honor the birth of Louis Braille. He was inventor of braille system of reading and writing used by blind people throughout the world. It is important to appreciate how braille has made life easier and better for millions of blind people around the world. This day also serves as powerful reminder of the need of equal rights, highlighting the importance of recognizing and empowering the blind in our global community. Braille is the system of raised dots that can be read with fingers by people who have low vision or are blind. Teachers, Parents and others who are not visually impaired ordinarily read braille with their eyes. Braille is not a language, rather it is code by which many languages- such as English, Spanish and dozen other may be written and read. Considering the abovesaid and in light of inclusion as per NEP 2020, Centre of Special

education designed the workshop for teacher trainees from all the aspects of teacher education to gain basic knowledge, understanding and application part of braille. The thought was motivated from the idea that every teacher should be empowered on dealing with learner from any ability background. This ability to read and write in braille would lead a future teacher to deal with visually impaired or low vision student in their class with efficacy. The workshop was organized and limited for 50 participants to give them hands-on exposure and practice in braille. Dr. Hemant Maurya expert from IITE, Shree Lalitbhai Mehta and Shri Hiteshbhai Chaudhari from Blind People Association were trainer for the same. Teacher-trainees were oriented about what braille is and then were followed by session on language writing and mathematical terms writing on braille. During the session the enthusiasm on part of trainee were so infectious that they prepared many braille sheets with raised dots and they enjoyed and appreciated working on it. It was identified that this kind of workshop should be organized on regular basis and for even extended duration of time. The feedback was positive that IITE and Centre of special education has decided to organize this workshop every year. On our part it was one step for reaching blind and visually impaired persons in field of education and making it a as ability which everyone should be aware of as individual making difference in inclusive society.

# **Life Skill Training Program**

Indian Institute of Teacher Education

17th and 18th January, 2024

Guru Drona Skill Department of IITE organized a Life Skills Training workshop for the Semester 2 students of B.Sc.B.Ed. and B.A.B.Ed. on 17<sup>th</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup> January 2024. The invited expert for the workshop was Mrs Krishna Patel, Head, Western Region, Aparajita Foundations.

Aparajitha Foundations is a part of Aparajitha Corporate Services, dedicated to the cause of transforming youth by imparting training for right attitude and greater awareness about their life. From the last 15 years, the organization has been making dedicated and effective efforts to build a stronger community through various programs. One of their preeminent CSR initiatives, started in 2008 with a vision to introduce life skills to students is TTT (Tim Tim Tare) designed on the basis of 10 core life skills defined by WHO which are extremely significant to lead a holistic life. This program is successfully running in more than 9 states in India.

The life skills selected for the two day workshop was Creative Thinking and Problem solving. The important points discussed in the sessions are:



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#### **Creative thinking:**

Creative Thinking is the ability to come up with unique, original solutions. Creative thinking skills are definitely not just for 'creative types' like artists and musicians. Everyone can benefit from creative thinking from time to time. Creative Thinking is a way of looking at problems or situations from a fresh perspective that suggests unorthodox solutions (which may look unsettling at first). Creative thinking can be stimulated both by an unstructured process such as brainstorming, and by a structured process such as lateral thinking. Typical examples of times when a person might take the time to use creative thinking techniques include:

- (i) When a person is facing a major problem or issue, and cannot see an obvious way forward.
- (ii) At times of change, when it is hard to see what might lie ahead, and may want to think about possible scenarios.
- (iii) When there is a lot of disagreement about what needs to happen next, and no compromise seems possible without a lot of effort.
- (iv) When a person needs something new, that has not been tried before, but we are not sure what.
- (v) On occasions like this, it may be worth doing some 'formal' creative thinking, and using a trained facilitator to help the group get the most out of the session.
  - Beyond 'formal' creative thinking opportunities, there are also things that we can do to help think more creatively on a routine basis.

#### These include:

- (i) 'Spreading the social wings' to get to know a wider and more diverse group of people. We all tend to get on best with people who are like us, and particularly people with the same background and overall views on life. However, associating with people who are like us tends to mean that our thinking gets a bit 'lazy'. Our assumptions go unchallenged, and our views tend to get reinforced.
  - Taking time to actively go out and meet new people—and particularly more diverse people, who are not so like us—will help us to challenge your assumptions.
- (ii) Embracing new opportunities and trying new things. It is worth challenging to learn a new skill, or do something that we find difficult, simply for the effect it will have on our thinking!
- (iii) Challenging stereotypes and forcing ourselves to think beyond the obvious. Being conscious of stereotypes, and asking oneself 'But why do I think that?' will help to surface our assumptions, and help to think more creatively.



(iv) Engaging with art, theatre and music. It seems that people who visit the theatre, go to concerts, or engage with other cultural activities are also more able to think creatively. The thinking is that these activities help us to see things from a new perspective, and therefore to think more creatively. They also, apparently, can help you to feel more connected, and generally kinder. Taking time to enjoy arts or create something in our leisure time will help us to broaden our horizons more generally.

#### **Problem Solving:**

Problem solving is the act of defining a problem; determining the cause of the problem; identifying, prioritizing, and selecting alternatives for a solution; and implementing a solution. Finding a suitable solution for issues can be accomplished by following the basic four-step problem-solving process and methodology outlined below.

#### Step 1: Define the problem

- ✓ Differentiate fact from opinion
- ✓ Specify underlying causes
- ✓ Consult each faction involved for information
- ✓ State the problem specifically



- ✓ Identify what standard or expectation is violated
- ✓ Determine in which process the problem lies
- ✓ Avoid trying to solve the problem without data

#### **Step 2: Generate alternative solutions**

- ✓ Postpone evaluating alternatives initially
- ✓ Include all involved individuals in the generating of alternatives
- ✓ Specify alternatives consistent with organizational goals
- ✓ Specify short- and long-term alternatives
- ✓ Brainstorm on others' ideas
- ✓ Seek alternatives that may solve the problem

#### Step 3: Evaluate and select an alternative

- ✓ Evaluate alternatives relative to a target standard
- ✓ Evaluate all alternatives without bias
- Evaluate alternatives relative to established goals
- ✓ Evaluate both proven and possible outcomes
- ✓ State the selected alternative explicitly

#### Step 4: Implement and follow up on the solution

- ✓ Plan and implement a pilot test of the chosen alternative
- ✓ Gather feedback from all affected parties
- ✓ Seek acceptance or consensus by all those affected
- ✓ Establish ongoing measures and monitoring
- Evaluate long-term results based on final solution

All the students participated in the workshop very enthusiastically and contributed in terms of Group discussion, Role Play and Games. The workshop concluded on a positive note with vote of thanks by Dr Jumisree Sarmah Pathak, Head, Guru Drona Skill Department. IITE.






